### FROM POPE FRANCIS

#### YOUR MISSION IN CHRIST

A Christian cannot think of his or her mission on earth without seeing it as a path of holiness, for "this is the will of God, your sanctification". Each saint is a mission, planned by the Father to reflect and embody, at a specific moment in history, a certain aspect of the Gospel.

That mission has its fullest meaning in Christ, and can only be understood through him. At its core, holiness is experiencing, in union with Christ, the mysteries of his life. It consists in uniting ourselves to the Lord's death and resurrection in a unique and personal way, constantly dying and rising anew with him. But it can also entail reproducing in our own lives various aspects of Jesus' earthly life: his hidden life, his life in community, his closeness to the outcast, his poverty and other ways in which he showed his self-sacrificing love. The contemplation of these mysteries, as Saint Ignatius of Loyola pointed out, leads us to incarnate them in our choices and attitudes. Because "everything in Jesus' life was a sign of his mystery", "Christ's whole life is a revelation of the Father", "Christ's whole life is a mystery of redemption", "Christ's whole life is a mystery of recapitulation". "Christ enables us to live in him all that he himself lived, and he lives it in us".

The Father's plan is Christ, and ourselves in him. In the end, it is Christ who loves in us, for "holiness is nothing other than charity lived to the full". As a result, "the measure of our holiness stems from the stature that Christ achieves in us, to the extent that, by the power of the Holy Spirit, we model our whole life on his". Every saint is a message which the Holy Spirit takes from the riches of Jesus Christ and gives to his people.

To recognize the word that the Lord wishes to speak to us through one of his saints, we do not need to get caught up in details, for there we might also encounter mistakes and failures. Not everything a saint says is completely faithful to the Gospel; not everything he or she does is authentic or perfect. What we need to contemplate is the totality of their life, their entire journey of growth in holiness, the reflection of Jesus Christ that emerges when we grasp their overall meaning as a person.

This is a powerful summons to all of us. You too need to see the entirety of your life as a mission. Try to do so by listening to God in prayer and recognizing the signs that he gives you. Always ask the Spirit what Jesus expects from you at every moment of your life and in every decision you must make, so as to discern its place in the mission you have received. Allow the Spirit to forge in you the personal mystery that can reflect Jesus Christ in today's world.

May you come to realize what that word is, the message of Jesus that God wants to speak to the world by your life. Let yourself be transformed. Let yourself be renewed by the Spirit, so that this can happen, lest you fail in your precious mission. The Lord will bring it to fulfilment despite your mistakes and missteps, provided that you do not abandon the path of love but remain ever open to his supernatural grace, which purifies and enlightens.

### EXPOSITION AND DIVINE MERCY PLEASE NOTE CHANGE OF TIME FOR SEPT 7 TO 5.30PM

### FROM FR. HENRY DUC

Our national political landscape has been shaken a bit recently due to the leadership challenge within the Coalition, and our Prime Minister has survived the coup initiated by his own Home Affairs Minister, Peter Dutton. By the time I write these words Mr Turnbull has been under enormous pressure from within the party to stand aside to make room for his treasurer, Scott Morrison and Peter Dutton to contest for the leadership.

Though normally uninterested in politics, I could not help to feel a bit sympathetic to Mr Turnbull, for I know it was very awful to be pushed around by his own team mates.

No matter what is going to happen to his future, I hope he would have found some consolation had he known that even Jesus had a bad day in his office as enfolded in the Gospel narrative this Sunday, following the accounts of the previous two weeks.

Last week and the week before, people made complaints about Jesus' claims that he is the bread that comes from heaven, and that the bread he gives is his own flesh.

This week they even go further in their reaction by claiming that his teaching is intolerable. Once again Jesus reiterates the message he said in the Gospel two weeks ago about how faith is granted to humanity only by God alone.

It is quite touching to hear the question he asks the Apostles at the end, 'what about you, do you want to go away too?' I just wonder whether Judas had made up his mind to betray him at this point? Peter's quick reaction, however, helps to reassure the Master that he and his mates are going to stick with Jesus, since he is the Holy One of God, the one who has the message of eternal life. Despite his strong words of support, Peter, however, went on to deny Jesus three times after His arrest as we obviously know.

In a way, this Gospel seems to help us realise that we truly are vulnerable as Jesus points out in his Passion that 'the spirit is willing, but the flesh is weak' (cf. Mt 26.41). Therefore, we should never be so proud of our own power and strengths, because we can make mistakes and can fall down at any time, but always put our trust in God. Let us give praise and thanks to God for drawing us to the belief in the Father, the Son and the Holy Spirit, for helping us to come to the table of the Eucharist, and for constantly strengthening our faith and trust with his never-ending grace. Have a trust-filled week. Fr. Henry
