FROM POPE FRANCIS NEW PELAGIANS

Still, some Christians insist on taking another path, that of justification by their own efforts, the worship of the human will and their own abilities. The result is a self-centred and elitist complacency, bereft of true love. This finds expression in a variety of apparently unconnected ways of thinking and acting: an obsession with the law, an absorption with social and political advantages, a punctilious concern for the Church's liturgy, doctrine and prestige, a vanity about the ability to manage practical matters, and an excessive concern with programmes of self-help and personal fulfilment. Some Christians spend their time and energy on these things, rather than letting themselves be led by the Spirit in the way of love, rather than being passionate about communicating the beauty and the joy of the Gospel and seeking out the lost among the immense crowds that thirst for Christ.

Not infrequently, contrary to the promptings of the Spirit, the life of the Church can become a museum piece or the possession of a select few. This can occur when some groups of Christians give excessive importance to certain rules, customs or ways of acting. The Gospel then tends to be reduced and constricted, deprived of its simplicity, allure and savour. This may well be a subtle form of pelagianism, for it appears to subject the life of grace to certain human structures. It can affect groups, movements and communities, and it explains why so often they begin with an intense life in the Spirit, only to end up fossilized... or corrupt.

Once we believe that everything depends on human effort as channelled by ecclesial rules and structures, we unconsciously complicate the Gospel and become enslaved to a blueprint that leaves few openings for the working of grace. Saint Thomas Aquinas reminded us that the precepts added to the Gospel by the Church should be imposed with moderation "lest the conduct of the faithful become burdensome", for then our religion would become a form of servitude.

The summation of the Law To avoid this, we do well to keep reminding ourselves that there is a hierarchy of virtues that bids us seek what is essential. The primacy belongs to the theological virtues, which have God as their object and motive. At the centre is charity. Saint Paul says that what truly counts is "faith working through love" (Gal 5:6). We are called to make every effort to preserve charity: "The one who loves another has fulfilled the law... for love is the fulfilment of the law" (Rom 13:8.10). "For the whole law is summed up in a single commandment, 'You shall love your neighbour as yourself'" (Gal 5:14).

In other words, amid the thicket of precepts and prescriptions, Jesus clears a way to seeing two faces, that of the Father and that of our brother. He does not give us two more formulas or two more commands. He gives us two faces, or better yet, one alone: the face of God reflected in so many other faces. For in every one of our brothers and sisters, especially the least, the most vulnerable, the defenceless and those in need, God's very image is found. Indeed, with the scraps of this frail humanity, the Lord will shape his final work of art. For "what endures, what has value in life, what riches do not disappear? Surely these two: the Lord and our neighbour. These two riches do not disappear!"

May the Lord set the Church free from these new forms of gnosticism and pelagianism that weigh her down and block her progress along the path to holiness! These aberrations take various shapes, according to the temperament and character of each person. So I encourage everyone to reflect and discern before God whether they may be present in their lives.

FROM FR. HENRY DUC

My grandfather, Dad's father, was a bookish man who had a good collection of the Vietnamese classics. I had the privilege to comb through it from a very young age, and then added on to it with a few contemporary items I bought later on when I had the opportunities to go to the bookshop in the city of Mytho where my seminary was located.



However, my grandfather's love of reading was cut short sometime before I had to flee Vietnam in 1984. His eyesight became very poor to the point he could no longer read anything. None in my family then had any idea that a simple cataract operation could solve such an optical problem, and Fred Hollows years later saw the need and moved in to help bring the sight back for thousands of the Vietnamese, who suffered a similar condition to my grandfather.

In a way, dare I say that Fred is a fine example to help us reflect well upon the healing work that Jesus performed in the Gospel today to give the eyesight to Bartimaeus, a blind beggar, who was dragging a miserable life by begging for help by the road side.

People obviously showed no regard for him, and he seemed to have even no right to ask for help from Jesus. 'Many of them scolded him and told him to keep quiet', Mark wrote in the narrative.

Jesus, on the other hand, refused to go with the flow, and chose to show respect to Bartimaeus' dignity by asking the man the question, 'what do you want me to do for you?' Bartimaeus was frank in telling Jesus of his need, which of course was his eyesight, and Jesus helped to fulfil his wish simply by telling him, 'Go, your faith has saved you.'

There are a few different points that we can talk about this Gospel reading, such as the power of faith, the symbol of the sight or the healing touch of Jesus. However, the gentle and respectful way that Jesus related to Bartimaeus tends to stand out. Pray that we all may be inspired by Jesus' example in showing our sincere respect to everyone around us, especially the down trodden and the disadvantaged. Have a courtesy-oriented week.

RCIA: We are inviting all who are interested to become Catholic to join our RCIA program 2018-2019. Please contact Fr Henry for a chat before the start of the program.


