

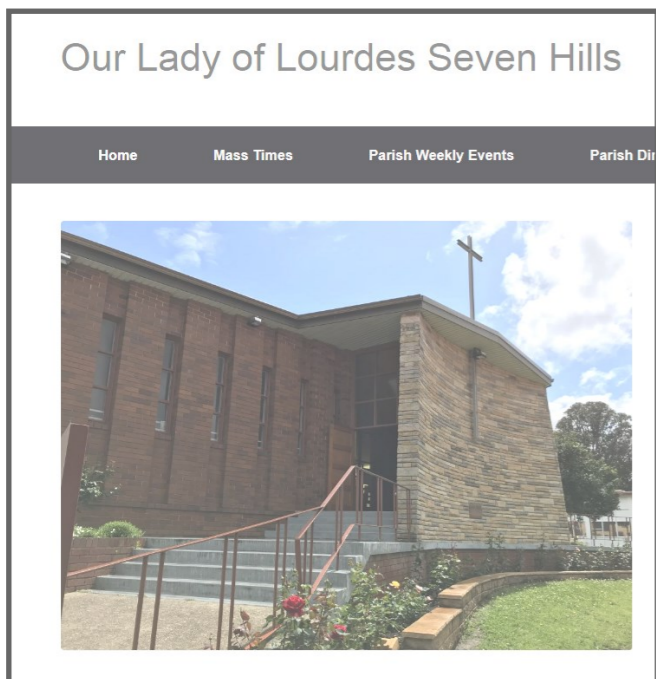

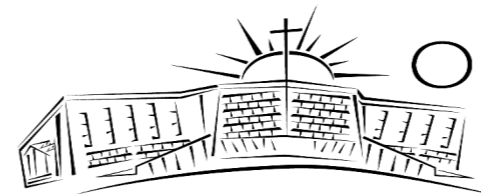
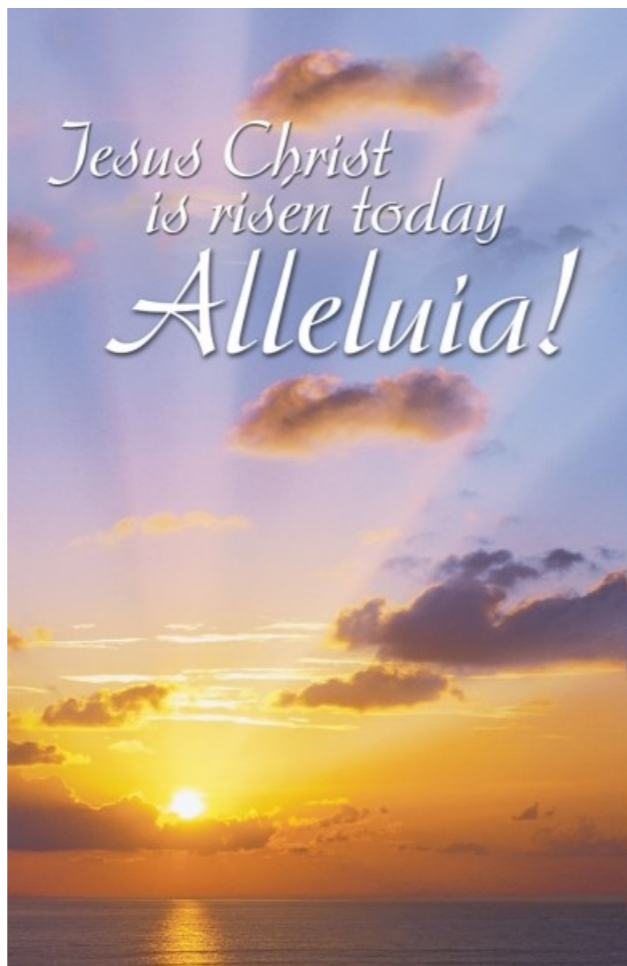

GOSPEL ACCLAMATION: Alleluia alleluia! Christ has become our paschal sacrifice; let us feast with joy in the Lord. Alleluia!

COMMUNION ANTIPHON: *Christ our Passover has been sacrificed, alleluia; therefore let us keep the feast with the unleavened bread of purity and truth, alleluia, alleluia.*

FROM POPE FRANCIS DISCERNMENT

How can we know if something comes from the Holy Spirit or if it stems from the spirit of the world or the spirit of the devil? The only way is through discernment, which calls for something more than intelligence or common sense. It is a gift which we must implore. If we ask with confidence that the Holy Spirit grant us this gift, and then seek to develop it through prayer, reflection, reading and good counsel, then surely we will grow in this spiritual endowment.

An urgent need: *The gift of discernment has become all the more necessary today, since contemporary life offers immense possibilities for action and distraction, and the world presents all of them as valid and good. All of us, but especially the young, are immersed in a culture of zapping. We can navigate simultaneously on two or more screens and interact at the same time with two or three virtual scenarios. Without the wisdom of discernment, we can easily become prey to every passing trend.*

This is all the more important when some novelty presents itself in our lives. Then we have to decide whether it is new wine brought by God or an illusion created by the spirit of this world or the spirit of the devil. At other times, the opposite can happen, when the forces of evil induce us not to change, to leave things as they are, to opt for a rigid resistance to change. Yet that would be to block the working of the Spirit. We are free, with the freedom of Christ. Still, he asks us to examine what is within us – our desires, anxieties, fears and questions – and what takes place all around us – “the signs of the times” – and thus to recognize the paths that lead to complete freedom. “Test everything; hold fast to what is good” (1 Thess 5:21).

Always in the light of the Lord: *Discernment is necessary not only at extraordinary times, when we need to resolve grave problems and make crucial decisions. It is a means of spiritual combat for helping us to follow the Lord more faithfully. We need it at all times, to help us recognize God’s timetable, lest we fail to heed the promptings of his grace and disregard his invitation to grow. Often discernment is exercised in small and apparently irrelevant things, since greatness of spirit is manifested in simple everyday realities. It involves striving untrammelled for all that is great, better and more beautiful, while at the same time being concerned for the little things, for each day’s responsibilities and commitments. For this reason, I ask all Christians not to omit, in dialogue with the Lord, a sincere daily “examination of conscience”. Discernment also enables us to recognize the concrete means that the Lord provides in his mysterious and loving plan, to make us move beyond mere good intentions. FROM FR. HENRY DUC

The youngest brother of a friend of mind ran an Asian Grocery shop in the Old Plaza of Bankstown, and I often called in to get supply of fresh fruit, since his shop always offered the freshest fruits compared to others around. Every time I called in and had a chat with him, I couldn’t help but think of the story his older brother told me years ago about him, when the family decided to embark on a sea-unworthy boat to escape Vietnam and left their parents behind. Since he was so attached to his mother and could have no sleep without her, the other brothers had to improvise and gave him a piece of his mums’ clothing, so that he could embrace it at night for a peaceful sleep. This young man, however, has since got married and now has high-school aged children. I often wonder whether he has still missed his mum after all these



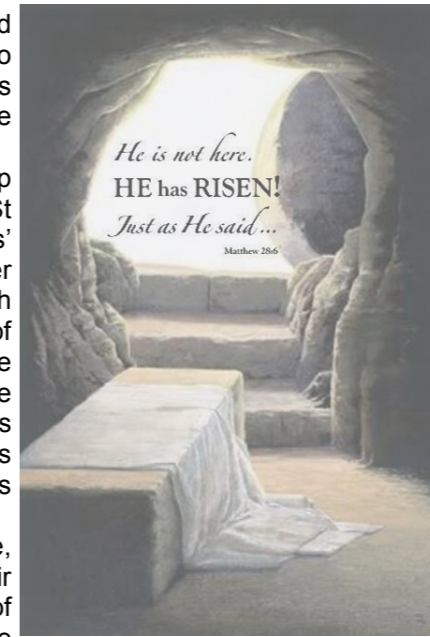
years. I have never had the courage to reveal to him the little secret his older brother once shared with me.

I hope this story can help us reflect well upon St John’s account of Jesus’ resurrection on Easter Sunday. Together with Peter, John was one of the most fortunate people to have the privilege to eye-witness the tomb, where Jesus was buried three days before.

They ran to the place, after the ladies in their group informed them of Jesus’ empty tomb. Luke in his account from the Easter Vigil identified them as Mary of Magdala, Joanna, and James’ mother named Mary, and went on to report that Peter did see nothing but Jesus’ binding cloths left in the tomb, and was amazed by what he saw. John, on the other hand, goes into more detail of what he saw: the linen cloths lay on the ground inside the tomb, and the cloth wrapping over Jesus’ head located at a different spot. Most significantly John solemnly declared that the scene of the empty tomb decorated with Jesus’ burial linen cloths brought him to faith in Jesus’ resurrection from the dead, something foretold not only by Jesus, but also by the teaching of scripture.

As we gather together to celebrate Jesus’ triumphant rise from the dead, a sign of great hope for us to be partakers in his glory one day, let us give praise and thanks to the Son of God for showing us what to do to reach eternal life. Pray that our faith may be strengthened by John’s testimony, and able to extend his mission to proclaim Jesus’ death and resurrection by means of our concrete deeds and words. In the joy of Easter, I would like to wish everyone a happy time filled with the Risen Lord’s blessings.

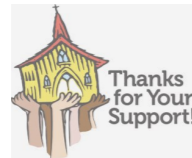
ACT OF LOVE
