FROM POPE FRANCIS

The digital environment

"The digital environment is characteristic of the contemporary world. Broad swathes of humanity are immersed in it in an ordinary and continuous manner. It is no longer merely a question of 'using' instruments of communication, but of



living in a highly digitalized culture that has had a profound impact on ideas of time and space, on our self-understanding, our understanding of others and the world, and our ability to communicate, learn, be informed and enter into relationship with others. An approach to reality that privileges images over listening and reading has influenced the way people learn and the development of their critical sense".

The web and social networks have created a new way to communicate and bond. They are "a public square where the young spend much of their time and meet one another easily, even though not all have equal access to it, particularly in some regions of the world. They provide an extraordinary opportunity for dialogue, encounter and exchange between persons, as well as access to information and knowledge. Moreover, the digital world is one of social and political engagement and active citizenship, and it can facilitate the circulation of independent information providing effective protection for the most vulnerable and publicizing violations of their rights. In many countries, the internet and social networks already represent a firmly established forum for reaching and involving young people, not least in pastoral initiatives and

Yet to understand this phenomenon as a whole, we need to realize that, like every human reality, it has its share of limitations and deficiencies. It is not healthy to confuse communication with mere virtual contact. Indeed, "the digital environment is also one of loneliness, manipulation, exploitation and violence, even to the extreme case of the 'dark web'. Digital media can expose people to the risk of addiction, isolation and gradual loss of contact with concrete reality, blocking the development of authentic interpersonal relationships. New forms of violence are spreading through social media, for example cyberbullying. The internet is also a channel for spreading pornography and the exploitation of persons for sexual purposes or through gambling".

FROM FR. HENRY DUC

One of the gifts I got for my ordination 'a few years ago' was a Parker pen, which I often brought out for couples to sign the register at Wedding occasions, and many couples used that humble pen to sign their documents in the last 24 years.



However, during a trip down to our local

Shopping Centre recently, I brought it along to sign a document at the Post Office. When the job was done, I rushed into our Woolies to do some shopping, and hurried to get home for an appointment.

Just a few minutes after I left the supermarket, I realised that my good old friend Parker wasn't with me anymore. I doublechecked my pockets and shopping bags, but it was nowhere

I hurried back to ask the staff guarding the self-checkout point whether she saw a lost pen somewhere. As she shook her head no, I felt quite depressed. It was quite absurd. Though the pen wasn't anything valuable, the sentimental value attached to it obviously was substantial.

In the context of loss, Jesus uses the three narratives of the Lost Sheep, the Lost Coin and the Prodigal Son to talk about God's boundless love and forgiveness given to us. Through these highly symbolic images, Jesus means to assure us that no matter how we might wander away from God like the lost sheep, or the coin or the younger son, God is always kind and patient to look for us with determination and willingness to bring us back for a happy re-union with him.

It is worth to note that these Gospel stories are preferred texts for church celebrations of Reconciliation, since they directly deal with Christian virtues, such as love and forgiveness, central to the sacrament of Reconciliation. In a way, this Gospel reminds us our need to treasure the beauty of such a forgiving sacrament and allow ourselves to be reunited with God through it both when we recite the I Confess at Mass, and when we go for confessions.

Let us pray today for ourselves, especially for the first group of children, who celebrate their First Holy Communion, for a deeper realisation of God's love given to us, and also for a better appreciation of God's mercy and forgiveness. Have a forgiveness-oriented week. Fr. Henry
