#### **FROM POPE FRANCIS** A way out

In this chapter, I have taken time to look at the reality of young people in today's world. Some other aspects will be dealt with in the following chapters.

As I have said. I do not claim to be exhaustive in this analysis. I encourage communities to examine, respectfully and seriously, the situation of their young people, in order to find the most fitting ways of providing them with pastoral care. At the same time, I do not want to end this chapter without addressing some words to each of you.

I remind you of the good news we received as a gift on the morning of the resurrection: that in all the dark or painful situations that we mentioned, there is a way out. For example, it is true that the digital world can expose you to the risk of self -absorption, isolation and empty pleasure. But don't forget that there are young people even there who show creativity and even genius. That was the case with the Venerable Carlo Acutis.

Carlo was well aware that the whole apparatus of communications, advertising and social networking can be used to lull us, to make us addicted to consumerism and buying the latest thing on the market, obsessed with our free time, caught up in negativity. Yet he knew how to use the new communications technology to transmit the Gospel, to communicate values and beauty.

Carlo didn't fall into the trap. He saw that many young people, wanting to be different, really end up being like everyone else, running after whatever the powerful set before them with the mechanisms of consumerism and distraction. In this way they do not bring forth the gifts the Lord has given them; they do not offer the world those unique personal talents that God has given to each of them. As a result, Carlo said, "everyone is born as an original, but many people end up dying as photocopies". Don't let that happen to you!

Don't let them rob you of hope and joy, or drug you into becoming a slave to their interests. Dare to be more, because who you are is more important than any possession. What good are possessions or appearances? You can become what God your Creator knows you are, if only you realize that you are called to something greater. Ask the help of the Holy Spirit and confidently aim for the great goal of holiness. In this way, you will not be a photocopy. You will be fully yourself.

If this is to happen, you need to realize one basic truth: being young is not only about pursuing fleeting pleasures and superficial achievements. .

#### FROM FR. HENRY DUC

Three months after my diaconate, I had access to a diocesan loan to buy a second hand Cressida, a discontinued model of Toyota. Due to my inexperience, I had two major problems with it: first it was with the engine which ran out of oil and had to be replaced, and second I got smashed by a truck while waiting at the traffic lights.

I remember when my car got hit and the truckie kept driving on just like nothing had ever happened, I began to chase him up until he was obliged to stop at the next traffic lights. He

refused to acknowledge that he caused the accident and tried to run away, until a good Samaritan, an elderly man, came out of his car to let him know that he was wrong and offered to be mv witness.

My trouble hadn't stopped there, since a week later, I received a rather threatening letter from the solicitor of the truck company telling me that it was me who caused the accident, and that I was driving a vehicle with no insurance – I didn't realize that the car insurance had run out for weeks therefore I was responsible to pay for all damages.



Fortunately, I met another Samaritan, who happened to be a parishioner 'cum' solicitor. Learning about my story, he volunteered to send a reply to the truck company, and things became more promising after that, as the other side accepted the responsibility and agreed to compensate. I can never forget what my volunteer solicitor told me about himself, that I can totally trust him. When asked why, he said to me, 'because I'm a poor solicitor!'

In the context of legal professions, Jesus in the Gospel this Sunday tells the story of an unjust judge, who has no fear of God and respects no one. Despite his unusual character as such, he was made to lend his professional support to a persistent widow, who kept asking him again and again for his service to protect her from her enemy's attack.

Through this highly symbolic story, Jesus means to encourage us his listeners to be ever patient and persistent in our prayers, similar to the way the widow approaches the judge in the Gospel account. If a judge, unjust like that, was prepared to help to the widow, should the Lord be more generous to those who ask for his assistance many times over, therefore, we have to ask Him repeatedly and surely He will never disappoint those who pray to Him with persistence.

Encouraged by Jesus' invitation in the Gospel today, let us ask Him for the wisdom to pray for what that is truly good for us, and the patience to keep us remain strong and persistent in our prayers.


