

## **FROM POPE FRANCIS CHAPTER FOUR**

## Christ saves you

The second great truth is that Christ, out of love, sacrificed himself completely in order to save you. His outstretched arms on the cross are the most telling sign that he is a friend who is willing to stop at nothing: "Having loved his own who were in the world, he loved them to the end" (Jn 13:1).

Saint Paul said that his life was one of complete trust in that self-sacrificing love: "I now live by faith in the Son of God who loved me, and gave himself for me" (Gal 2:20)

The same Christ who, by his cross, saved us from our sins, today continues to save and redeem us by the power of his total self-surrender. Look to his cross, cling to him, let him save you, for "those who accept his offer of salvation are set free from sin, sorrow, inner emptiness and loneliness". And if you sin and stray far from him, he will come to lift you up by the power of his cross. Never forget that "he forgives us seventy times seven. Time and time again, he bears us on his shoulders. No one can strip us of the dignity bestowed upon us by this boundless and unfailing love. With a tenderness that never disappoints but is always capable of restoring our joy, he makes it possible for us to lift up our heads and to start

"We are saved by Jesus because he loves us and cannot go against his nature. We can do any number of things against him, yet he loves us and he saves us. For only what is loved can be saved. Only what is embraced can be transformed. The Lord's love is greater than all our problems, frailties and flaws. Yet it is precisely through our problems, frailties and flaws that he wants to write this love story. He embraced the prodigal son, he embraced Peter after his denials, and he always, always, always embraces us after every fall, helping us to rise and get back on our feet. Because the worst fall, and pay attention to this, the worst fall, the one that can ruin our lives, is when we stay down and do not allow ourselves to be helped up"

His forgiveness and salvation are not something we can buy, or that we have to acquire by our own works or efforts. He forgives us and sets us free without cost. His self-sacrifice on the cross is so great that we can never repay it, but only receive it with immense gratitude and with the joy of being more greatly loved than we could ever imagine: "He loved us first" (1 Jn 4:19).

Young people, beloved of the Lord, how valuable must you be if you were redeemed by the precious blood of Christ! Dear young people, "you are priceless! You are not up for sale! Please, do not let yourselves be bought. Do not let yourselves be seduced. Do not let yourselves be enslaved by forms of ideological colonization that put ideas in your heads, with the result that you end up becoming slaves, addicts, failures in life. You are priceless. You must repeat this always: I am not up for sale; I do not have a price. I am free! Fall in love with this freedom, which is what Jesus offers".

#### FROM FR. HENRY DUC

After a presentation about astronomy not long ago, I asked the speaker about the stand of scientists working in this field in regard to the question of God's existence, and his answer was that there has been a mixed response. Some have their faith in God strengthened due to their findings, and others have gone to the opposite way.

I am no scientist, but I am confident to utter that what our

science has got so far is just a discovery of elements out there, which have been created by the One we call God. I wonder whether it makes real sense for them to claim that, since it is quite childish.

Our scientists, I think, are no more than children playing the Treasure Hunting game, for all what they have done is more or less like kids proudly show other children piece and pieces of treasures they found hidden by parents in the garden. It's totally naive and wrong for them to claim that the treasures have been there by themselves with no parental

In the Gospel this week, the Saducees, who had no belief in the next life obviously were very childish and over confident for thinking that they could beat Jesus with the fancy story about a woman, who, according to Moses' law, was eligible to marry all seven brothers due to their deaths, and their trump question to Jesus was to whom of those seven brothers the woman will belong to wife.

From a human perspective, such a question seemed to be quite thorny to deal with, since no judge would satisfy seven brothers for their claim to be her lawful husband, but Jesus was quick to let them know that what is going to happen in the post resurrection life will be beyond what they think, consequently it is useless to apply what they experience here and now to that. Jesus makes it very clear that things will not be the same, because those to be given a membership of that world known as heaven to us shall be like the angels and enjoy an endless life.

As Jesus' disciples, we believe in the resurrection and the life to come, and profess it at every Sunday Mass, let pray that this earthly and passing life of ours today may help prepare us to gain membership for the coming life Jesus has promised to us, the one that will never ever end. In the spirit of the communion of Saints, let us also offer our special prayers before God for all the souls throughout this month, pray that they shall soon be given a share in the world of the resurrection
