#### FROM POPE FRANCIS **CHAPTER FIVE**

#### A time of dreams and decisions (continued)

The love of God and our relationship with the living Christ do not hold us back from dreaming; they do not require us to narrow our horizons. On the contrary, that love elevates us, encourages us and inspires us to a better and more beautiful life. Much of the longing present in the hearts of young people can be summed up in the word "restlessness". As Saint Paul VI said, "In the very discontent that you often feel... a ray of light is present". Restless discontent, combined with exhilaration before the opening up of new horizons, generates a boldness that leads you to stand up and take responsibility for a mission. This healthy restlessness typical of youth continues to dwell in every heart that remains young, open and generous. True inner peace coexists with that profound discontent. As Saint Augustine said: "You have created us for yourself, Lord, and our hearts are restless until they find their rest in

Sometime ago, a friend asked me what I see in a young person. My response was that "I see someone who is searching for his or her own path, who wants to fly on their two feet, who faces the world and looks at the horizon with eyes full of the future, full of hope as well as illusions. A young person stands on two feet as adults do, but unlike adults, whose feet are parallel, he always has one foot forward, ready to set out, to spring ahead. Always racing onward. To talk about young people is to talk about promise and to talk about joy. Young people have so much strength; they are able to look ahead with hope. A young person is a promise of life that implies a certain degree of tenacity. He is foolish enough to delude himself, and resilient enough to recover from that delusion".

Some young people might hate this stage of life, because they want to continue being children or indefinitely prolong their adolescence and put off having to make decisions. "Fear of the definitive thus generates a kind of paralysis of decision-making. Yet youth cannot remain on hold. It is the age of choices and herein lies its fascination and its greatest responsibility. Young people make decisions in professional, social and political fields, and in other more radical ways that determine the shape of their lives". They also make decisions about love, choosing a spouse and starting a family. We will look at these issues more closely in the final chapters, when dealing with individual vocations and their discernment.

### FROM FR. HENRY DUC

Following a failed attempt to leave Vietnam by boat 36 years ago, my other two friends and I were so hungry after days of living on food portions, so the three of us decided to call into a

restaurant for a meal before heading back to the seminary. Unfortunately we were stopped by a policeman checking our IDs as we walked out of the place, and I was so frightened for I knew for sure that what we have done was completely illegal and could take us to jail, and even worse, I carried no ID with me.

However, one of my companions, who left the country a few years after me and was ordained as priest for a diocese in Canada, was rather calm and street-wise, so he kept talking to the man in uniform and offering some good cigarettes. He even dared to tell the man that he was related to some senior officers in the police force, and when asked to provide the name of the officer, he had no hesitation to give him that. As a result, the police man began to change his attitude toward us, became friendlier and then let us go with no further questions asked. I could not believe that we could get away with that simple trick. What a divine intervention!

In the Gospel today, John the Baptist really had a hard go at the Pharisees and Sadducees as they came to him seeking for baptism. John was very much aware of the fact that these men were extremely proud of themselves as descendants of Abraham, and wrongly thought that such a relationship was enough for them to claim a membership in God's family, so he

wanted to neutralize it by giving them the warning that God the Almighty is capable of turning the stones into children of Abraham. He then went on to challenge them to repent and make their lives religiously fruitful through good works, otherwise they shall be harshly dealt with.

John the Baptist' message to the Pharisees and Sadducees today very much echoes Jesus' words later on concerning what is required for the membership of the Kingdom of heaven that people have to put into practice the will of his heavenly Father, not just say to him 'Lord, Lord' (cf. Mt 7.21). Let us pray today that we may be able to take to our hearts John the Baptist's message to prepare the way for Jesus both through our praise and worship, and especially through our works of charity.
