FROM POPE FRANCIS CHAPTER FIVE In friendship with Christ

No matter how much you live the experience of these years of your youth, you will never know their deepest and fullest meaning unless you encounter each day your best friend, the friend who is Jesus.

Friendship is one of life's gifts and a grace from God. Through our friends, the Lord refines us and leads us to maturity. Faithful friends, who stand at our side in times of difficulty, are also a reflection of the Lord's love, his gentle and consoling presence in our lives. The experience of friendship teaches us to be open, understanding and caring towards others, to come out of our own comfortable isolation and to share our lives with others. For this reason, "there is nothing so precious as a faithful friend" (Sir 6:15).

Friendship is no fleeting or temporary relationship, but one that is stable, firm and faithful, and matures with the passage of time. A relationship of affection that brings us together and a generous love that makes us seek the good of our friend. Friends may be quite different from one another, but they always have things in common that draw them closer in mutual openness and trust.[80]

Friendship is so important that Jesus calls himself a friend: "I do not call you servants any longer, but I call you friends" (Jn 15:15). By the gift of his grace, we are elevated in such a way that we truly become his friends. With the same love that Christ pours out on us, we can love him in turn and share his love with others, in the hope that they too will take their place in the community of friendship he established. And even as he enjoys the complete bliss of the life of the resurrection, we, for our part, can work generously to help him build his kingdom in this world, by bringing his message, his light, and above all his love, to others (cf. Jn 15:16). The disciples heard Jesus calling them to be his friends. It was an invitation that did not pressure them, but gently appealed to their freedom. "Come and see", Jesus told them; so "they came and saw where he was staying, and they remained with him that day" (Jn 1:39). After that unexpected and moving encounter, they left everything and followed him.

Friendship with Jesus cannot be broken. He never leaves us, even though at times it appears that he keeps silent. When we need him, he makes himself known to us (cf. Jer 29:14); he remains at our side wherever we go (cf. Jos 1:9). He never breaks his covenant. He simply asks that we not abandon him: "Abide in me" (Jn 15:4). But even if we stray from him, "he remains faithful, for he cannot deny himself" (2 Tim 2:13). the young people and the entire people of God]

FROM FR. HENRY DUC

During my annual retreat last November, I had a chance to catchup with Br Bill Tarrant MSF, who used to live in our parish and helped to conduct lots of Spiritual presentations for us. That was delightful to see him again, who now lives with his

community near Varroville, where I had the retreat. Apart from a nice meal he offered me, Br Bill also surprised me with an early Christmas present, a book by Fr Richard Leonard SJ, called What Are We Waiting For?, containing of short reflections for Advent and Christmas. Fr Leonard's strengths, perhaps, lie in his storytelling skills and rich life experience I found very captivating.

I remember in his reflection upon the feast of the Holy Family, he talked about a recent survey of married couples, who shared their experience about what make their families happy. These couples really had something to say, since they had been together between fifty to seventy years. They named these qualities as the top three ingredients making happiness always present in their families, namely LOVE, GRATITUDE,



The love they mentioned in fact, was a sacrificial one, which encouraged them to be happy to give and take, and prepared to put their partner and children first. The second quality of gratitude very echoes what Pope Francis has been calling our married to put into practice, which is about making the words PLEASE and THANK YOU central to their family life. I was very impressed to hear what a young-at-heart wife talked about her husband, 'I can't think of a time in my sixty-year marriage and family life that my husband hasn't said 'please' and 'thank you.' I have never felt taken for granted. From making a cup of tea to having a baby, he always sincerely says 'please' and 'thank you.' With forgiveness, a more challenging virtue to carry out, one of those couples shared their tip to survive that 'from small annoying things to a few big moments, genuine forgiveness has been essential for us facing a crisis and not getting trapped there. It has enabled us to learn, deal with it, grow, and move on.' Fr Leonard also throws in a practical advice from his master, St Ignatius Loyola for those who may find themselves not ready to forgive others, he invited them to start praying for the desire to want to forgive others. For the feast of the Holy Family this week, Matthew gives us the story of their escape to Egypt to avoid Herod's persecution. This journey driving them of their homeland does not simply turn them into iconic symbols of all refugees throughout the world, but also make them examples for all married couples to look up, for their ability to remain tightly united and connected in the most difficult moment of their lives. Let us pray for all families in our parish, and also for families of refugees all over the world, that the Holy Family of Jesus. Mary, and Joseph always remains their inspiring example to look upon in time of needs. May it grant them wisdom, strength and support to walk their earthly walk, and one day happily join it in the heavenly home.
