

FROM POPE FRANCIS CHAPTER SIX

Young people with roots—continued

Along with the stratagems of a false cult of youth and appearance, we are also witnessing attempts to promote a spirituality without God, an affectivity without community or concern for those who

suffer, a fear of the poor, viewed as dangerous, and a variety of claims to offer a future paradise that nonetheless seems increasingly distant. I do not want to offer you any such thing, and with great love I urge you not to let yourselves be taken in by this ideology. It will not make you any younger, but enslave you instead. I propose another way, one born of freedom, enthusiasm, creativity and new horizons, while at the same time cultivating the roots that nourish and sustain us.

In this regard, I would note that "many Synod Fathers coming from non-Western contexts pointed out that in their countries globalization is bringing with it forms of cultural colonization that sever young people from their cultural and religious roots. The Church needs to make a commitment to accompanying these young people, so that in the process they do not lose sight of the most precious features of their identity".

Today, in fact, we see a tendency to "homogenize" young people, blurring what is distinctive about their origins and backgrounds, and turning them into a new line of malleable goods. This produces a cultural devastation that is just as serious as the disappearance of species of animals and plants. For this reason, in addressing young indigenous people gathered in Panama, I encouraged them to "care for your roots, because from the roots comes the strength that is going to make you grow, flourish and bear fruit". [Pope Francis, apostolic exhortation, CHRISTUS VIVIT —to the young people and the entire people of God1

FROM FR. HENRY DUC

With the start of Ash Wednesday, we officially enter the forty days and nights of Lent, a very special time in the Church, which is both biblical and meaningful. Going through the Bible, we realise that the number forty has something to do with significant events, such as (1) the great flood on Noah's day that took place for forty days and forty nights to cleanse the entire world, (2) the period of forty long years the Israelites were made to wander in the desert prior to their settlement in the Promised Land, and especially (3) the length of forty days and nights Jesus stayed in the wilderness for fasting and praying before his public ministry. It is handy to know that during the first three centuries most Christian people appeared to prepare for Easter by fasting for only two or three days, but in some places, some preferred to do it for the whole week, the period we call the Holy Week today. In Rome, this period went for three weeks and then increased up into Lent of forty day, of course not including Sundays, for the reason that Sunday is always a Paschal time.

The Gospel for this First Sunday of Lent takes us a long way back to the time after Jesus' spell of forty days and nights of fasts and prayers in the desert, and he had to go through three major temptations thrown at him by the devil, while he was tired and hungry.

Despite the devil's hard efforts to use human needs, power and fame as baits to fish him, Jesus had refused to back off, smartly used the scriptural wisdom to push

back the devil's advance, and finally made him to follow his order to go away as a looser.

The most telling message this Gospel seems to convey to us could be about the constant threat of temptations in our everyday lives,

and Pope Francis is very right when he has kept reminding us of the threatening presence of the devil in our world. However, he is not invincible and can be overcome and defeated by the power of God, and Jesus' victory today is a good example of that.

Let us ask the Lord to help deepen and strengthen our faith, so that we may always remain faithful to him both in good and testing times.
