## FROM POPE FRANCIS The limits of reason

It is not easy to grasp the truth that we have received from the Lord. And it is even more difficult to express it. So we cannot claim that our way of

understanding this truth authorizes us to exercise a strict supervision over others' lives. Here I would note that in the Church there legitimately coexist different ways of interpreting many aspects of doctrine and Christian life; in their variety, they "help to express more clearly the immense riches of God's word". It is true that "for those who long for a monolithic body of doctrine guarded by all and leaving no room for nuance, this might appear as undesirable and leading to confusion". Some currents of gnosticism scorned the concrete simplicity of the Gospel and attempted to replace the trinitarian and incarnate God with a superior Unity, wherein the rich diversity of our history disappeared. In effect, doctrine, or better, our understanding and

expression of it, "is not a closed system, devoid of the dynamic capacity to pose questions, doubts, inquiries...The questions of our people, their suffering, their struggles, their dreams, their trials and their worries, all possess an interpretational value that we cannot ignore if we want to take the principle of the incarnation seriously. Their wondering helps us to wonder, their questions question us". A dangerous confusion can arise. We can think that because we know something, or are able to explain it in certain terms, we are already saints, perfect and better than the "ignorant masses". Saint John Paul II warned of the temptation on the part of those in the Church who are more highly educated "to feel somehow superior to other members of the faithful". In point of fact, what we think we

know should always motivate us to respond more fully to

God's love. Indeed, "you learn so as to live: theology and

holiness are inseparable".

When Saint Francis of Assisi saw that some of his disciples were engaged in teaching, he wanted to avoid the temptation to gnosticism. He wrote to Saint Anthony of Padua: "I am pleased that you teach sacred theology to the brothers, provided that... you do not extinguish the spirit of prayer and devotion during study of this kind". Francis recognized the temptation to turn the Christian experience into a set of intellectual exercises that distance us from the freshness of the Gospel. Saint Bonaventure, on the other hand, pointed out that true Christian wisdom can never be separated from mercy towards our neighbour: "The greatest possible wisdom is to share fruitfully what we have to give... Even as mercy is the companion of wisdom, avarice is its enemy". "There are activities that, united to contemplation, do not prevent the latter, but rather facilitate it, such as


works of mercy and devotion".

are temporarily out the reach of those trying to get rid of them, they have still faced with enormous problems, such as shelters, clean water, food, clothing, education, sanitation and health services.

While the Rohingya crisis has not been resolved, there is another one obviously looming over in Yemen namely the famine, which starts to pose serious threats amongst civilians, especially children caught up between the two warring groups in the country.

Despite these life- threatening crisis, our world leaders seem to remain unaware of them, and instead, prefer to talk about other issues such as tariffs, globalisation and patriotism. I wish they would have a chance to hear the strong words of St James in the second reading this Sunday meant to remind the rich, who have no consideration for the unfortunate around them. The writer warns them that it was nothing but 'a burning fire' they store up. To avoid this fiery end, they perhaps need to follow the path Jesus shows us in the Gospel story, which is to offer charitable help to those in need, even in the smallest way, such as giving a cup of water for someone to drink. Works of charity, in no doubt, will help drench the suffering of the needy and gain a heavenly reward for those with generous hearts.

Let us ask the Lord to heed his invitation to give our helping hand in whichever way we can to those needing our care and assistance both here and throughout the world today, consequently we shall deserve our claim as belonging to Jesus, and the reward he promised.

The three groups of parishioners that met last week enjoyed their sharing process so much that they agreed to meet again to complete the remaining four sessions of the Plenary Council booklet. **ALL parishioners** are free to join in the remaining meetings and have their say in the future guidelines for the church in Australia. Each of the groups listed the return to the third rite of reconciliation as a top priority. Other items listed as high priority were:

- Building and maintaining a solid faith foundation.
- Fostering good communication through culturally integrating, socially, outreach (good deeds) and corporal works of mercy.
- Option for priests to marry.
- Education in schools. Weekly Mass, regular reconciliation and Catholic values and traditions.
- Strengthening of the community in terms of personal relationships.
- What can we do to engage adults after/outside the Sacramental Programs.
- Other items the groups considered important were: spiritual development at school level, promotion of better relationships with other faiths, building relationships within the family and evangelisation starts from the family.

The attendees listed 84 items that they considered needed to be addressed which covered the whole range of matters requiring attention by the church in Australia. All these items have been forwarded to the Diocese and the Plenary Council as part of their listening process. You all need to think deeply about what needs to be done to update our church in this modern age and **Have Your Say**. Your voice matters.
