FROM POPE FRANCIS THE SAINTS "NEXT DOOR"

The Holy Spirit bestows holiness in abundance among God's holy and faithful people, for "it has pleased God to make men and women holy and to save them, not as individuals without any bond between them, but rather as



a people who might acknowledge him in truth and serve him in holiness". In salvation history, the Lord saved one people. We are never completely ourselves unless we belong to a people. That is why no one is saved alone, as an isolated individual. Rather, God draws us to himself, taking into account the complex fabric of interpersonal relationships present in a human community. God wanted to enter into the life and history of a people.

I like to contemplate the holiness present in the patience of God's people: in those parents who raise their children with immense love, in those men and women who work hard to support their families, in the sick, in elderly religious who never lose their smile. In their daily perseverance I see the holiness of the Church militant. Very often it is a holiness found in our next-door neighbours, those who, living in our midst, reflect God's presence. We might call them "the middle class of holiness".

Let us be spurred on by the signs of holiness that the Lord shows us through the humblest members of that people which "shares also in Christ's prophetic office, spreading abroad a living witness to him, especially by means of a life of faith and charity". We should consider the fact that, as Saint Teresa Benedicta of the Cross suggests, real history is made by so many of them. As she writes: "The greatest figures of prophecy and sanctity step forth out of the darkest night. But for the most part, the formative stream of the mystical life remains invisible. Certainly the most decisive turning points in world history are substantially codetermined by souls whom no history book ever mentions. And we will only find out about those souls to whom we owe the decisive turning points in our personal lives on the day when all that is hidden is revealed".

Holiness is the most attractive face of the Church. But even outside the Catholic Church and in very different contexts, the Holy Spirit raises up "signs of his presence which help Christ's followers". Saint John Paul II reminded us that "the witness to Christ borne even to the shedding of blood has become a common inheritance of Catholics, Orthodox, Anglicans and Protestants". In the moving ecumenical commemoration held in the Colosseum during the Great Jubilee of the Year 2000, he stated that the martyrs are "a heritage which speaks more powerfully than all the causes of division".

Pope Francis, apostolic exhortation, GAUDETE ET EXSULTATE

FROM FR. HENRY DUC

Perhaps in response to Pope Francis' invitation in his apostolic exhortation called Amoris Laetitia meaning the Joy of Love, German bishops recently started discussions about whether divorced and remarried Catholics should be admitted to the sacraments after a process of discernment.



On the one hand, there are bishops who advocate for the admission from the love and mercy perspective, which sees the sacraments, especially the Eucharist, as a remedy for sick souls; and on the other hand, others firmly maintain the traditional position of the Church regarding the matter.

The ball, I think, is in the hands of individual bishops, who are encouraged by the Pope to exercise the power given to them,

meant to bring pastoral benefits to the people entrusted to their care, especially those in special need. However, many of them seem to look and sound rather uncomfortable with the new approach, for they have been used to be told exactly what to do.

In the Gospel this week, Jesus tells the disciples about what he thinks of marriage; that it should be indissoluble, meaning it can not be broken, since God Himself is the One who unites women and men together in marriage.

However, Jesus is also aware of the law given by Moses to grant permission of divorce to his contemporaries, and it is important to note that Moses' law obviously was more favourable to men, since a man was simply required to supply a note declaring the intention to divorce his wife, and hand it to her in the presence of witnesses. Consequently, it was far easier for men to arrange a divorce.

From the marriage platform, we can see the significance of the next point he makes about children. Perhaps it is more than just an encouragement to let children come to him and learn to welcome the Kingdom of God in a child-like way. It is also a challenge for us all to show greater care for children, especially those affected by broken relationships.

Today, let us pray for all married couples, that they continue to enjoy their married life and bear faithful witness to their marriage covenant. Let us also remember those couples, who find their differences irreconcilable and pray that they will be given support and help to remain sacramentally connected to the Church and that their children shall be well looked after and receive whatever assistance they need for a good growth.

The three groups of parishioners that met last week enjoyed their sharing process so much that they agreed to meet again to complete the remaining four sessions of the Plenary Council booklet. **ALL parishioners** are free to join in the remaining meetings and have their say in the future guidelines for the church in Australia. Each of the groups listed the return to the third rite of reconciliation as a top priority. Other items listed as high priority were:

- Option for priests to marry.

- Other items the groups considered important were: spiritual development at school level, promotion of better relationships with other faiths, building relationships within the family and evangelisation starts from the family.

The attendees listed 84 items that they considered needed to be addressed which covered the whole range of matters requiring attention by the church in Australia. All these items have been forwarded to the Diocese and the Plenary Council as part of their listening process. You all need to think deeply about what needs to be done to update our church in this modern age and **Have Your Say**. Your voice matters. The next meeting will be held after the school holidays and the completion of the planned car park reconstruction.
