FROM POPE FRANCIS **BOLDNESS AND PASSION (Part 2)**

Like the prophet Jonah, we are constantly tempted to flee to a safe haven. It can have many names: individualism, spiritualism, living in a little world, addiction, intransigence, the



rejection of new ideas and approaches, dogmatism, nostalgia, pessimism, hiding behind rules and regulations. We can resist leaving behind a familiar and easy way of doing things. Yet the challenges involved can be like the storm, the whale, the worm that dried the gourd plant, or the wind and sun that burned Jonah's head.

For us, as for him, they can serve to bring us back to the God of tenderness, who invites us to set out ever anew on our journey. God is eternal newness. He impels us constantly to set out anew, to pass beyond what is familiar, to the fringes and beyond. He takes us to where humanity is most wounded. where men and women, beneath the appearance of a shallow conformity, continue to seek an answer to the question of life's meaning. God is not afraid! He is fearless! He is always greater than our plans and schemes. Unafraid of the fringes, he himself became a fringe (Phil 2:6-8; Jn 1:14). So if we dare to go to the fringes, we will find him there; indeed, he is already there. Jesus is already there, in the hearts of our brothers and sisters, in their wounded flesh, in their troubles and in their profound desolation. He is already there. True enough, we need to open the door of our hearts to Jesus, who stands and knocks (Rev 3:20).

Sometimes I wonder, though, if perhaps Jesus is already inside us and knocking on the door for us to let him escape from our stale self-centredness. In the Gospel, we see how Jesus "went through the cities and villages, preaching and bringing the good news of the kingdom of God" (Lk 8:1). After the resurrection, when the disciples went forth in all directions, the Lord accompanied them (Mk 16:20). This is what happens as the result of true encounter. Complacency is seductive; it tells us that there is no point in trying to change things, that there is nothing we can do, because this is the way things have always been and yet we always manage to survive. By force of habit we no longer stand up to evil. We "let things be", or as others have decided they ought to be. Yet let us allow the Lord to rouse us from our torpor, to free us from our inertia. Let us rethink our usual way of doing things; let us open our eyes and ears, and above all our hearts, so as not to be complacent about things as they are, but unsettled by the living and effective word of the risen Lord. We are inspired to act by the example of all those priests, religious, and laity who devote themselves to proclamation and to serving others with great fidelity, often at the risk of their lives and certainly at the cost of their comfort. Their testimony reminds us that, more than bureaucrats and functionaries, the Church needs passionate missionaries, enthusiastic about sharing true life. The saints surprise us, they confound us, because by their lives they urge us to abandon a dull and dreary mediocrity. Let us ask the Lord for the grace not to hesitate when the Spirit calls us to take a step forward.

Let us ask for the apostolic courage to share the Gospel with others and to stop trying to make our Christian life a museum of memories. In every situation, may the Holy Spirit cause us to contemplate history in the light of the risen Jesus. In this way, the Church will not stand still, but constantly welcome the Lord's surprises.

FROM FR. HENRY DUC

To our parish community, February has always been a special month since it marks our feast day, the feast of Our Lady of Lourdes, who first appeared to Bernadette Soubirous on 11 February, 1858 at the grotto of Massabielle in a town called Lourdes, in the southwest of France.



For five months between February 11 untill 16 July 1858, Our Lady, who identified herself as the Immaculate Conception, was said to have appeared to Bernadette 18 times altogether. She asked Bernadette two things. Firstly, to have a chapel built in her honour, and secondly to bathe and drink from a spring that began to flow after 24 February 1858, the day she gave Bernadette the instruction. Consequently, the bath at Lourdes has been associated with miraculous healings that many thousands of people from all over the world have experienced.

Bernadette joined the Sisters of Charity and Christian Instruction at Nevers in 1865 and died in 1879 exactly 140 years ago. She was beatified in 1925 and canonised in 1933. Bernadette's life does not simply highlight her personal call to be Jesus' disciple with the mission to kindle in people's heart a devout love for his mother and her healing touch, it also helps to reflect the Gospel story of how Jesus called the three fishermen Peter, James and John. This mission was to follow him and become fisher of men, a story, which, in turn, helps to inspire all of us at Our Lady of Lourdes, Seven Hills, to be mindful of our call to lead all we associate with back or closer to Jesus by means of our witnessing words

Pray that each of us may get ready and able to lead others around us closer to Jesus and his mother by means of our exemplary lives, very much inspired by the gentle and healing dimension of Our Lady of Lourdes, our Patroness. Our Lady of Lourdes, pray for us.
