

#### FROM POPE FRANCIS SPIRITUAL COMBAT, VIGILANCE AND **DISCERNMENT**

strength and courage to withstand the temptations of the devil and to proclaim the Gospel. This battle is sweet, for it allows us to rejoice each time the Lord triumphs in our lives.



COMBAT AND VIGILANCE— We are not dealing merely with a battle against the world and a worldly mentality that would deceive us and leave us dull and mediocre, lacking in enthusiasm and joy. Nor can this battle be reduced to the struggle against our human weaknesses and proclivities (be they laziness, lust, envy, jealousy or any others). It is also a constant struggle against the devil, the prince of evil. Jesus himself celebrates our victories. He rejoiced when his disciples made progress in preaching the Gospel and overcoming the opposition of the evil one: "I saw Satan fall like lightning from heaven" (Lk 10:18).


We will not admit the existence of the devil if we insist on regarding life by empirical standards alone, without a supernatural understanding. It is precisely the conviction that this malign power is present in our midst that enables us to understand how evil can at times have so much destructive force. True enough, the biblical authors had limited conceptual resources for expressing certain realities, and in Jesus' time epilepsy, for example, could easily be confused with demonic possession. Yet this should not lead us to an oversimplification that would conclude that all the cases related in the Gospel had to do with psychological disorders and hence that the devil does not exist or is not at work. He is present in the very first pages of the Scriptures, which end with God's victory over the devil. Indeed, in leaving us the Our Father, Jesus wanted us to conclude by asking the Father to "deliver us from evil". That final word does not refer to evil in the abstract; a more exact translation would be "the evil one". It indicates a personal being who assails us. Jesus taught us to ask daily for deliverance from him, lest his power prevail over us.

#### FROM FR. HENRY DUC

About ten years ago, I invited a rather young priest to come to our parish to help with our First Reconciliation, and he really surprised me with a skill that no one had ever shown me before.

Prior to the start of the Rite, I handed him a copy of the Gospel and asked him to assist in the liturgy by proclaiming the Gospel. Instead of



According to the Evangelist in the introduction, this highly symbolic story is Jesus' attempt to respond to the complaint from the Pharisees and the scribes about his association with the people they considered as sinners. The father obviously represents God, who is always kind, generous and forgiving, and the two sons represent all of us, including those who fall into the temptation of wandering away from God and waste his gifts on worthless things, and also those who are weighed down by envy and selfishness.

Through this story, Jesus perhaps intends to remind his critics that he is doing nothing but following his Father's example in showing his love and compassion to the marginalised and sinners, and hence challenge them to do the same by showing compassion and forgiveness to others, especially the marginalised.

From a Sacramental perspective, this story has been used in the Church to highlight how kind and how forgiving God is, and hence encourage us to have the courage to stand up and come back to ask for His forgiveness through the Sacrament of Reconciliation or Confession, and God for sure will never fail to forgive us.

It's worth noting some significant symbols found in this Gospel narrative, such as the robe given by the father to the younger son when he came back which is the symbol of royalty, the ring which is the symbol of authority, and the sandals which indicate his important status in the family. Together they convey the message that the son is completely forgiven by the father for his past failures, and fully restored to his previous position in the family.

Inspired by the message of this Gospel story, let us pray for a greater and stronger appreciation of the Sacrament of Reconciliation amongst Catholics, and also for the courage and wisdom from our Church leaders to take appropriate steps in responding to the need of the wider community with regard to the issue of Reconciliation.
