



FROM POPE FRANCIS IN CONSTANT PRAYER

Finally, though it may seem obvious, we should remember that holiness consists in a habitual openness to the transcendent, expressed in prayer and adoration. The saints are distinguished by a spirit of prayer and a need for

communion with God. They find an exclusive concern with this world to be narrow and stifling, and, amid their own concerns and commitments, they long for God, losing themselves in praise and contemplation of the Lord. I do not believe in holiness without prayer, even though that prayer need not be lengthy or involve intense emotions.

Saint John of the Cross tells us: "Endeavour to remain always in the presence of God, either real, imaginative, or unitive, insofar as is permitted by your works". In the end, our desire for God will surely find expression in our daily lives: "Try to be continuous in prayer, and in the midst of bodily exercises do not leave it. Whether you eat, drink, talk with others, or do anything, always go to God and attach your heart to him".

For this to happen, however, some moments spent alone with God are also necessary. For Saint Teresa of Avila, prayer "is nothing but friendly intercourse, and frequent solitary converse, with him who we know loves us". I would insist that this is true not only for a privileged few, but for all of us, for "we all have need of this silence, filled with the presence of him who is adored". Trust-filled prayer is a response of a heart open to encountering God face to face, where all is peaceful and the quiet voice of the Lord can be heard in the midst of silence.

In that silence, we can discern, in the light of the Spirit, the paths of holiness to which the Lord is calling us. Otherwise, any decisions we make may only be window-dressing that, rather than exalting the Gospel in our lives, will mask or submerge it. For each disciple, it is essential to spend time with the Master, to listen to his words, and to learn from him always. Unless we listen, all our words will be nothing but useless chatter.

We need to remember that "contemplation of the face of Jesus, died and risen, restores our humanity, even when it has been broken by the troubles of this life or marred by sin. We must not domesticate the power of the face of Christ". So let me ask you: Are there moments when you place yourself quietly in the Lord's presence, when you calmly spend time with him, when you bask in his gaze? Do you let his fire inflame your heart? Unless you let him warm you more and more with his love and tenderness, you will not catch fire. How will you then be able to set the hearts of others on fire by your words and witness? If, gazing on the face of Christ, you feel unable to let yourself be healed and transformed, then enter into the Lord's heart, into his wounds, for that is the abode of divine mercy. Due to his severe illness, an elderly man had a nightmare, in which he happened to see Satan appear to him with a very scary look. 'Do you know who I am?' asked Satan. 'Sure I do,' replied the man with a rather calm voice. 'Are you scared of me?' gueried Satan. 'No, not at



all,' replied the man with an unusual confidence. 'I can make your life miserable, put you in pain, take away your life, and then throw you in fiery hell for eternity.' 'Yes, I know that,' the man had still managed to maintain his cool. 'Now tell me, why are you not scared of me like others?' Satan dropped his menacing voice and pleaded with him instead. 'I've been married to your sister for more than 50 years,' whispered the man with a sneaky smile!

In the Gospel marking the First Sunday of Lent this week, the evangelist recalls the story of how Jesus, physically tired after forty days and nights of prayers and fasting in the wilderness, was approached by Satan, who cleverly used food, power and fame as means to confuse, distract and turn Jesus away from his mission. In return, Jesus firmly stood his ground, convincingly turned down every deceptive offer of the devil with his divine wisdom and power, frustrated the prince of darkness and eventually chased him away. Jesus' temptations in a way remind us all of the constant threat of temptations that we have to face in our daily lives. No matter who and where we are, temptations for sure, will follow us and try to turn us away from the Lord. Pope Francis

has again and again brought to our attention such a danger that might cause us lot of damage if we fail to take extra caution.

More significantly, Jesus' victory over his tempter obviously is quite an inspiration for us to reflect upon, since it tells us that just like him, we can overcome temptations and we can defeat the devil if we stick to the script Jesus has prepared for us, which is to embrace his way: the way of love, the way of the cross. Lent is a special time for us to be inspired by such a way and re-commit ourselves to follow his way from Death to Resurrection through prayers, through works of charity and through self-improving activities.

Let us pray for the grace and courage to faithfully follow Jesus' way to face whatever temptations we might encounter in our everyday lives, and turn them into credits for eternity.

AFFORDABLE HOUSING & ENERGY

This Thursday 14th March 6pm for 6:30pm Sydney Town Hall Housing and Energy Assembly.

THE ISSUE: To move people in bottom fifth income bracket out of housing stress, 7,000 social housing dwellings need to be built each year for the next 20 years. This is 20% of housing production each year. Inquiries and reports have been happening since 2004 without enforceable results.
