FROM POPE FRANCIS A supernatural gift

Certainly, spiritual discernment does not exclude existential, psychological, sociological or moral insights drawn from the human sciences. At the same time, it transcends them. Nor are the Church's sound norms sufficient. We should

always remember that discernment is a grace. Even though it includes reason and prudence, it goes beyond them, for it seeks a glimpse of that unique and mysterious plan that God has for each of us, which takes shape amid so many varied situations and limitations. It involves more than my temporal well-being, my satisfaction at having accomplished something useful, or even my desire for peace of mind. It has to do with the meaning of my life before the Father who knows and loves me, with the real purpose of my life, which nobody knows better than he. Ultimately, discernment leads to the wellspring of undying life: to know the Father, the only true God, and the one whom he has sent, Jesus Christ (cf. Jn 17:3). It requires no special abilities, nor is it only for the more intelligent or better educated. The Father readily reveals himself to the lowly (cf. Mt 11:25).

Lord speaks to us in a variety of ways, at work, through others and at every moment. Yet we simply cannot do without the silence of prolonged prayer, which enables us better to perceive God's language, to interpret the real meaning of the inspirations we believe we have received, to calm our anxieties and to see the whole of our existence afresh in his own light. In this way, we allow the birth of a new synthesis that springs from a life inspired by the Spirit.


FROM FR. HENRY DUC

Last Sunday morning, just like other Christian communities all over the world, the Sri Lankan Catholics joyfully gathered together in their local churches to celebrate Easter. They were unaware of suicide bombers quietly walking into three of their churches, and also into various hotels throughout the country to detonate their

bombs, making it the bloodiest Easter Sunday we have ever had. 321 including many children had their lives cut short and more than 500 were injured. No one would have imagined multiple massacres could happen in such sacred places in our world, and yet it did happen just a week ago. An unthinkable nightmare has become real due to some mad desire of a group of mad people in our time. Let us remember in our prayer this weekend those who lost their lives or have been injured in the Sri Lankan multiple bombings, especially our brothers and sisters in faith. May the Risen Christ grant them a share in his Kingdom, where we are all headed.

In the context of the unthinkable, the Gospel of John this weekend presents to us with the story of how the Risen Christ dealt with Thomas, who treated the accounts of his friends about Jesus' resurrection as something unthinkable, and even publicly challenged them to put his finger into the wounded hands and his hand into the pieced side of his Master as a must to bring him to such a belief.

To Thomas' surprise, Jesus did appear once again with the disciples, while they and Thomas himself were gathering in a house with doors completely shut. Through the inclusion of the 'closed doors' detail, John perhaps means to highlight the brand new status of the Risen Christ, which is divine, metaphysical and beyond what his disciples had been used to experiencing. Perhaps this helps explain why he instructed Mary of Magdala when she first met him outside his tomb, 'don't cling to me, because I have not yet ascended to the Father', and then went on to ask her to spread the news of his



Jesus then challenged Thomas to go ahead with his challenge, something he, of course, did not have the courage to do. All he could do was to utter five simple words, 'my Lord and my God', simple and yet enough to verify his Master's resurrection, that it truly was Jesus that he had met.

Most significantly, Jesus then makes this extra ordinary statement, 'you believe because you can see me. Happy are those who have not seen and yet believe.' Here Jesus seems to use the opportunity to send a transgenerational message of affirmation to future generations of his believers, who come to faith in him thanks to the testimony of the disciples, that they are blessed, too as much as those who had the privilege to see him face to face.

Today, let us give praise and thanks for the testimony of the disciples to help enrich our faith in Jesus, especially his death and Resurrection. Let us ask the Risen Lord to help strengthen our faith as he strengthened Thomas' in his moment of doubts, especially when we feel spiritually shaken or discouraged.
