FROM POPE FRANCIS

Post-Synodal Apostolic Exhortation CHRISTUS VIVIT — to the young people and to the entire people of God

Christ is alive! He is our hope, and in a wonderful way he brings youth to our world, and everything he touches becomes young, new, full of life. The very first words, then, that I would like to say to every young

Christian are these: Christ is alive and he wants you to be alive!

He is in you, he is with you and he never abandons you. However far you may wander, he is always there, the Risen One. He calls you and he waits for you to return to him and start over again. When you feel you are growing old out of sorrow, resentment or fear, doubt or failure, he will always be there to restore your strength and your hope.

With great affection, I address this Apostolic Exhortation to all Christian young people. It is meant to remind you of certain convictions born of our faith, and at the same time to encourage you to grow in holiness and in commitment to your personal vocation. But since it is also part of a synodal process, I am also addressing this message to the entire People of God, pastors and faithful alike, since all of us are challenged and urged to reflect both on the young and for the young. Consequently, I will speak to young people directly in some places, while in others I will propose some more general considerations for the Church's discernment.

I have let myself be inspired by the wealth of reflections and conversations that emerged from last year's Synod. I cannot include all those contributions here, but you can read them in the Final Document. In writing this letter, though, I have attempted to summarize those proposals I considered most significant. In this way, my words will echo the myriad voices of believers the world over who made their opinions known to the Synod. Those young people who are not believers, yet wished to share their thoughts, also raised issues that led me to ask new questions.

CHAPTER ONE

What does the word of God have to say about young people? Let us draw upon some of the richness of the sacred Scriptures, since they often speak of young people and of how the Lord draws near to encounter them.

In the Old Testament

In an age when young people were not highly regarded, some texts show that God sees them differently. Joseph, for example, was the youngest of his family (cf. Gen 37:2-3), yet God showed him great things in dreams and when only seventeen years old he outshone all his brothers in important affairs (cf. Gen 37-47).

In Gideon, we see the frankness of young people, who are not used to sugar-coating reality. When told that the Lord was with him, he responded: "But if the Lord is with us, why then have all these things happened to us?" (Jg 6:13). God was not offended by that reproach, but went on to order him: "Go in this might of yours and deliver Israel!" (Jg 6:14).

Samuel was still a young boy, yet the Lord spoke to him. Thanks to the advice of an adult, he opened his heart to hear God's call: "Speak, Lord, for your servant is listening" (1 Sam 3:9-10). As a result, he became a great prophet who intervened at critical moments in the history of his country. King Saul was also young when the Lord called him to undertake his mission (cf. 1 Sam 9:2).

FROM FR. HENRY DUC

In my father's days, there used to be a rather hostile relationship between Catholics and Buddhists belonging to a local Buddhist sect in my village. Even the parish priest was once taken away by force by the sect administrators to be interrogated and released after a week kept in captivity after



some delicate negotiations between the two sides. Such a sectarian war no longer exists there these days and everyone seems to get along well.

I can see how a problem like that can occur in a community where Catholics and Buddhists live side by side, however, it is more difficult to see how such a problem can occur where people from various Christian denominations have shared similar territories. A parishioner of ours shared with me her reservations about what she saw in a place in Europe where Catholics and Protestants still harbour hard feelings towards each other, with no effort made to hide this from visitors.

It is unbelievable that such an attitude is still alive in the modern world today. Obviously it has to be the opposite of the commandment that Jesus entrusts to us, his followers to put into action, which is to love one another as he has loved us. Love must be the Christian signature, the sign for the world around to recognise their Christian identity. Surely, they can claim to be anything they like except Christians, since they have failed to bear witness to love, the most basic mark of their faith. They have truly done nothing but a big disservice to Christianity, and I wonder what non-Christians would say when they see such an ongoing hostility?

Let us pray today that each of us will be more conscious of our duty to let everyone around us know that we truly are disciples of Jesus by the way we live out his teaching of love both at home and beyond.
