#### FROM POPE FRANCIS

CHAPTER 3. You are the "now" of God

After this brief look at the word of God, we cannot just say that young people are the future of our world. They are its present: even now, they are helping to enrich it. Young people are no longer children. They are at a time of life when they begin to

assume a number of responsibilities, sharing alongside adults in the growth of the family, society and the Church. Yet the times are changing, leading us to ask: What are today's young people really like? What is going on in their lives?

#### In positive terms

The Synod recognized that the members of the Church do not always take the approach of Jesus. Rather than listening to young people attentively, "all too often, there is a tendency to provide prepackaged answers and ready-made solutions, without allowing their real questions to emerge and facing the challenges they pose". Yet once the Church sets aside narrow preconceptions and listens carefully to the young, this empathy enriches her, for "it allows young people to make their own contribution to the community, helping it to appreciate new sensitivities and to consider new questions". We adults can often be tempted to list all the problems and failings of today's young people. Perhaps some will find it praiseworthy that we seem so expert in discerning difficulties and dangers. But what would be the result of such an attitude? Greater distance, less closeness, less mutual assistance. Anyone called to be a parent, pastor or guide to young people


must have the farsightedness to appreciate the little flame that continues to burn, the fragile reed that is shaken but not broken (cf. Is 42:3). The ability to discern pathways where others only see walls, to recognize potential where others see only peril. That is how God the Father see things; he knows how to cherish and nurture the seeds of goodness sown in the hearts of the young. Each young person's heart should thus be considered "holy ground", a bearer of seeds of divine life, before which we must "take off our shoes" in order to draw near and enter more deeply into the Mystery.[

However, since the closing ceremony of the Council on 7 December, 1965 up till now, there started an ongoing debate within the Church about how to interpret Vatican II teachings between the two groups, named by Massimo Faggioli in his Vatican II, the Battle for Meaning as Neo-Augustinians, regarding the Church as an island of grace in a sinful world. therefore the world can't be trusted and Neo-Thomists. following the footsteps of St Thomas in seeking faith through reasoning and scientific methodology, and there is no sign that this ongoing debate is going to settle any time soon. At the local level, despite a great sense of excitement amongst the people of God in our preparations for the Plenary Council 2020, there are signs of resistance both vocal and passive,

sadly from a pocket of clergy who begin to throw seeds of

scepticism and pessimism in the community all in the name of

Those experiences above, perhaps, might help us to reflect better upon the message that Jesus speaks to us in the Gospel this Sunday about what he calls fire and division that he brings to the earth. Perhaps, he means to remind us of the inspiring, and yet challenging nature of his teachings, which always inspire and enrich us, and encourage us to think and respond in a variety of ways.

Let us give praise and thanks to our Lord for his inspiring Good News, and pray that we all will continue to treasure it and allow it to challenge, enlighten and empower us in fruitful wavs.
