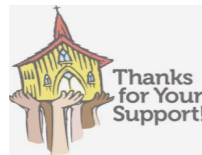

FROM POPE FRANCIS CHAPTER FIVE

A time of dreams and decisions (continued)
But opposed to these hopes and dreams that generate decisions, there is always the temptation to complain or give up. "We can leave that to those who worship the 'goddess of lament'... She is a false goddess: she makes you take the wrong road. When everything seems to be standing still and stagnant, when our personal issues trouble us, and social problems do not meet with the right responses, it does no good to give up. Jesus is the way: welcome him into your 'boat' and put out into the deep! He is the Lord! He changes the way we see life. Faith in Jesus leads to greater hope, to a certainty based not on our qualities and skills, but on the word of God, on the invitation that comes from him. Without making too many human calculations, and without worrying about things that challenge your security, put out into the deep. Go out of yourselves".

Keep following your hopes and dreams. But be careful about one temptation that can hold us back. It is anxiety. Anxiety can work against us by making us give up whenever we do not see instant results. Our best dreams are only attained through hope, patience and commitment, and not in haste. At the same time, we should not be hesitant, afraid to take chances or make mistakes. Avoid the paralysis of the living dead, who have no life because they are afraid to take risks, to make mistakes or to persevere in their commitments. Even if you make mistakes, you can always get up and start over, for no one has the right to rob you of hope.

Dear young people, make the most of these years of your youth. Don't observe life from a balcony. Don't confuse happiness with an armchair, or live your life behind a screen. Whatever you do, do not become the sorry sight of an abandoned vehicle! Don't be parked cars, but dream freely and make good decisions. Take risks, even if it means making mistakes. Don't go through life anaesthetized or approach the world like tourists. Make a ruckus! Cast out the fears that paralyze you, so that you don't become young mummies. Live! Give yourselves over to the best of life! Open the door of the cage, go out and fly! Please, don't take early retirement.

Young people living in rural areas in Vietnam love to go hunting not just because they love this sport, but also because hunting does help them to get extra food for their family tables, and I used to be one of those in my younger days. Recently I read a horrible story about two friends going out for a hunting trip in the forest in the highlands of the northern Vietnam, and one of them made a deadly mistake by shooting at his mate hiding behind the bush, for he mistook his poor friend with a wild animal, and the result was one of them came home as a dead man, a victim of his friend's imprudence. Traditionally, prudence is considered as a highly regarded virtue for us Christians, for it inspires us to know what to do in various concrete situations which we have to face with, such as where to stop as we start to have a drink. According to St Thomas Aquinas, *'the prudent man considers things afar off, in so far as they tend to be a help or a hindrance to that, which has to be done at the present time.'*

In the Gospel this Sunday, the one of joy, John the Baptist shows us a perfect example of what it means to be prudent. Despite his familiarity with Jesus due to the kinship between Mary and Elisabeth and his imprisonment, he was determined to send his disciples to approach Jesus and ask him to clarify the question whether he was the true Messiah, whom the world was waiting for, and Jesus elegantly verified his messianic identity through a brief of his ministry. Jesus then went on to praise his cousin John as the greatest person of all the children born of women, who, at the same, had been yet so humble to the point, that 'the least in the kingdom of heaven is greater than he is.'



Let us be inspired by John's wonderful example of a prudent man, and let us pray for the gift of prudence, so that we may be able to discern what we need to do more or cut back in the ways we spiritually prepare ourselves for the commemoration of Christmas this year.
