# Parish History

On Christmas Day in 1951 and 1952, Rev Bernard Massey from Blacktown celebrated Mass in the Memorial Hall, Seven Hills. By June 1953, numbers had increased to such an extent that he was obliged to use the Memorial Hall as a regular Mass Centre. Rev Hugh Law was appointed Priest-in-Charge at Blacktown, following Rev Massey's death in 1957. To cope with the development of Seven Hills and Lalor Park, he formed a Seven Hills Parish Committee, which welcomed Rev Bill O'Connor as Parish Priest of Seven Hills on 12 February 1959. The previous day had been the Feast of Our Lady of Lourdes, the name bestowed on the new parish.

1960 was a memorable year for the parish. In February a church-school, St Bernadette's at Lalor Park was opened. A temporary presbytery was purchased at 10 Federal Road, Seven Hills and in December, Rev Murphy was appointed Assistant Priest. In February 1961, after only two years, Seven Hills Parish was split in two, Lalor Park and Seven Hills. A new presbytery was purchased for Seven Hills in September 1964 to replace the temporary house in Federal Road.

Our Lady of Lourdes Church was blessed and opened on 11 February 1962 and the first three classrooms of our school were completed in 1962 for classes to begin in January 1963. The glass and timber walls of the church were replaced by brick walls in the early 1980s. When Rev Bill O'Connor retired on 1 April 1991 he had served as Parish Priest for 32 years.

In 1991 a Parish Centre was provided by converting the house at 4 Olive Street, into offices and meeting rooms. The Parish Centre was moved to its present position in 1996.

Rev Edward Sequeira served as the second Parish Priest from June 1991 to June 2000. Rev John Boyle was appointed as Parish Priest in July 2000. Rev Henry Huu Duc Tran was appointed Parish Priest on 5 October 2006 and installed on 11 March 2007. Early in January 2009, the very old and deteriorated roof of the Church was replaced with a modern insulated roof. Easter 2009 marked a significant step in the Parish in its cyber-mission as the Parish Website was officially launched to help people keep in touch with the Parish via the Internet.

By October 2010, a major school building project, part of the Diocese "Project Genesis", fruit of the Australian Government's stimulus package, provided the

school with a brand-new library and refurbished and reconfigured learning spaces suitable for 21st Century learning. The Parish now has a new Parish Meeting Room formerly used as a Kindergarten classroom.

What a wonderful and exciting year 2012 was for us when we celebrated our Golden Jubilee which included Our Parish Dinner/Dance, Youth Talent Quests, and finally our Thanksgiving Mass and Garden Party. It was a marvellous year full of many blessings and joy.

In September 2013, a new set of glass doors was installed at the rear of the church to allow the church foyer to remain open after the weekday Mass. The church has now become more accessible to all, who would like to drop in for a prayer at any time throughout the day.

Towards the end of 2013 and throughout 2014, meetings between the Parish Pastoral Council and interested members of the Parish helped develop a pastoral plan for our community focusing on the area of liturgy, welcoming ministry and youth ministry inspired by the Faith in the Future Program of the Diocese.

From the first Friday of December 2014, the first Friday of the new liturgical year, due to the spiritual need of our parish, the first Friday Exposition of the Blessed Sacrament and the Divine Mercy Novena began to take place in our Church.

In November 2015, the Parish Office had the ceiling renovated and the lighting was updated to LEDs as a result of water damage. As a community the Parish officially welcomed the ministry of Wardens. 2015 also marks the birth of the Welcoming Group as a part of our implementation of the Pastoral Plan. Early in the year, members were installed and have begun to carry out their welcoming ministry both in welcoming parishioners to the Church and providing information at the Information Desk located in the foyer of the parish.

From early September 2015 works began to upgrade the Church and car park lights into LEDs, and new cabinets were installed both in the Church's Sacristy and Parish Meeting Room. The Parish Meeting Room in the future is to be re-named 'The Cregan Room' in the memory of Mr Cregan a generous parishioner who bequeathed his estate to the Parish.

True to its name, the Holy Year of Mercy, 2016 was packed with mercy-orientated devotions. These included First Friday Rosary, Divine Mercy Chaplet, Benediction and Mass. Parish Projects throughout the Year of Mercy included the Way of Mercy Weekend for Seven Hills, Lalor Park and Toongabbie Parishes

and our Mercy Box project to raise funds for a remote community in East Timor to provide a reliable water supply system. 2016 saw a new Colorbond fence erected to replace the old, worn out and badly damaged fence line.

Our Youth Ministry has enjoyed a flourishing year with the birth of the Four2Eight Youth Group, where a dozen of children in school years 4 to 8 come together on the first Sunday the month. We look forward to its future development.

Thanks to the efforts of the School Principal Keiran Byrnes and Fr Henry, the upper carpark was fully upgraded in October 2017. As well, the Parish Hall and Meeting Room lights were changed to LEDs. A basic PA system was installed in the Parish Meeting Room and the upgrading of the Parish Hall PA system was completed.

2017 was a big year for the parish with the major project of the upgrading of our carpark. Thanks to the support of the Catholic Education Office in Parramatta and the school, we were able to have the top car park completed in due time.

In this year, we also saw the establishment of the Lourdes Young Adults group which continues to grow and thrive with the dedication and commitment of our parish youth leadership team.

In 2018, the last piece of our car park puzzle was finally put together with the reconstruction of the driveway and the resurfacing of the lower carpark. We are truly grateful to the Catholic Education Office for its generosity to absorb all of the costs for this part of the works. Apart from the lower carpark, the rest of the church fence was also erected, and a new garden established.

On February 19<sup>th</sup> 2019 our Parish Church was installed with air-conditioners. The installation was completed on Friday 22<sup>nd</sup> February at 9.30pm

In the first week of September 2019, the old bitumen footpath connecting the Church to Olive Street and Parish Office was replaced with a new safe concrete footpath. This footpath was completed on 9<sup>th</sup> October in time for the last term of school.

2020 has proven to be a year of mixed blessings, presenting our parish with both unprecedented challenges and opportunities due to the Pandemic.

In term of challenges: from Palm Sunday to Pentecost, we were forced to cease all physical group meetings and Masses.



During this lockdown period, Seven Hills Nursing Home remained a no-go zone and all monthly visits to our house-bound parishioners had to be cancelled.

Also, during this very challenging time, two funerals took place with the attendance of less than 20 people allowed.

However, it was not all bad news for our community, as we were able to adapt and thrive under such extraordinary circumstances. Right from day one of the shutdown, we managed to move most of our services on-line, and keep Sunday Masses available to as many as we could through live-streaming. This is thanks to the efforts of our Parish staff, our volunteers, our Young Adults group headed by Ian Epondulan, whose dedication and generosity are truly beyond words.

For three precious months, the lockdown handed us a rare opportunity to concentrate on some major upgrade projects. The upgrades started with the installation of new cupboards for our parish hall kitchen in the last week of March, then the re-painting of the parish meeting room and office roofs in mid-April. This was followed by work on the parish hall roof and finally the Church ceiling was thoroughly fixed and painted, and the Church roof was given a good clean up.

Compared to 2020, 2021 has been far more challenging to all of us, especially to our Parish Community, as we had to stay in lockdown for nearly four months, and all traditional forms of pastoral activities, such as Anointing and Communion to the sick, nursing home visits and Hospital visits, were not permitted.

The only major project to install the Church roof with Solar panels this year was delayed due to lockdown, however we managed to have it done in December, together with the security cameras.

Apart from the hiccup, caused by the unannounced visit of two Police officers one Saturday night, we have managed to maintain our weekly bulletin and keep our live-streamed Mass Service, ever lively and ever available both to our Parishioners and a global congregation, thanks to our committed staff, our volunteers, and particularly Ian, Ryan Epondulan and Michelle Flores, who were prepared to give their best to serve under the most apocalypse like circumstances.



# Sacramental Celebrations

## Baptisms

### Infant Baptism

**Preparation:** Please ring our parish office to make a booking for Baptismal preparation. Parents are required to attend a preparation session prior to their child's Baptism.

**Presentation Ceremony:** Your child will be presented to the parish community during one of our Sunday Masses, preferably at the 9.30am Mass prior to the celebration of Baptism.

**Baptismal donation:** Due to the invaluable nature of a Sacrament, there is no set fee for Baptism. However, it has been a custom for people to offer a donation on the occasion of the Baptism of their child. This donation is not retained by the priest or parish but goes into a Pastoral Revenue Fund which is used to support priests throughout the Diocese.

### Adult Baptism (RCIA) Program

All adults who wish to join our Catholic tradition are invited to take part in the Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults (RCIA) starting in early September and finishing with Baptism at the Easter Vigil. The process also includes scope to cater for adults who were baptised into another Christian tradition and would like to become Catholic. Please contact the parish office for more information.

## Marriages

People living in the Parish who plan to have their wedding at Our Lady of Lourdes will need to contact the Parish Office at least six months before the intended date of the wedding. Those who live outside our parish boundaries are welcome to have their wedding in our church on condition that they are able to provide a celebrant approved by the Diocese.

A stipend is required. This is not retained by the Parish but is forwarded to the Pastoral Revenue Fund.

All couples are required to complete a pre-marriage course prior to the wedding.

# Sacramental Program

## First Reconciliation & First Holy Communion

Our Parish-based Sacramental Program takes place every year preparing children in years 3 and over, for the Sacraments of Penance and First Holy Communion commencing 6th February and finishing in September.

An information evening will take place on the 9<sup>th</sup> November 2022, for those wishing to enroll in the following year's program. Parents are the primary people responsible for the faith formation of children and have an integral role in the process of children preparing to celebrate the sacraments. ## Anointing of the Sick

Healing Mass: 8.00am every first Thursday of the month in which the Sacrament of Anointing is administered.

If a person wishes to receive the Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick and Holy Communion in the hospital, please indicate on the hospital form that you are Catholic and that you wish to receive these Sacraments, so that hospital staff may be able to make the necessary arrangements for either the clergy or lay people to attend to your sacramental needs.

## Funerals

Below are a few practical points that you may find helpful regarding funerals in our parish:

Contact the funeral director of your choice to arrange the funeral.

Contact Fr Henry as soon as possible to begin preparations for the funeral Mass or service. Our parish is also able to prepare booklets and/or prayer cards for funerals. Please let Fr Henry know if you would like to make use of this service.

Funeral offerings: Although there is no set fee, it has been a custom for people to make an offering on the occasion of a funeral which, as required by our Diocese, is put into a Pastoral Revenue Fund for the support of all priests throughout the Diocese.

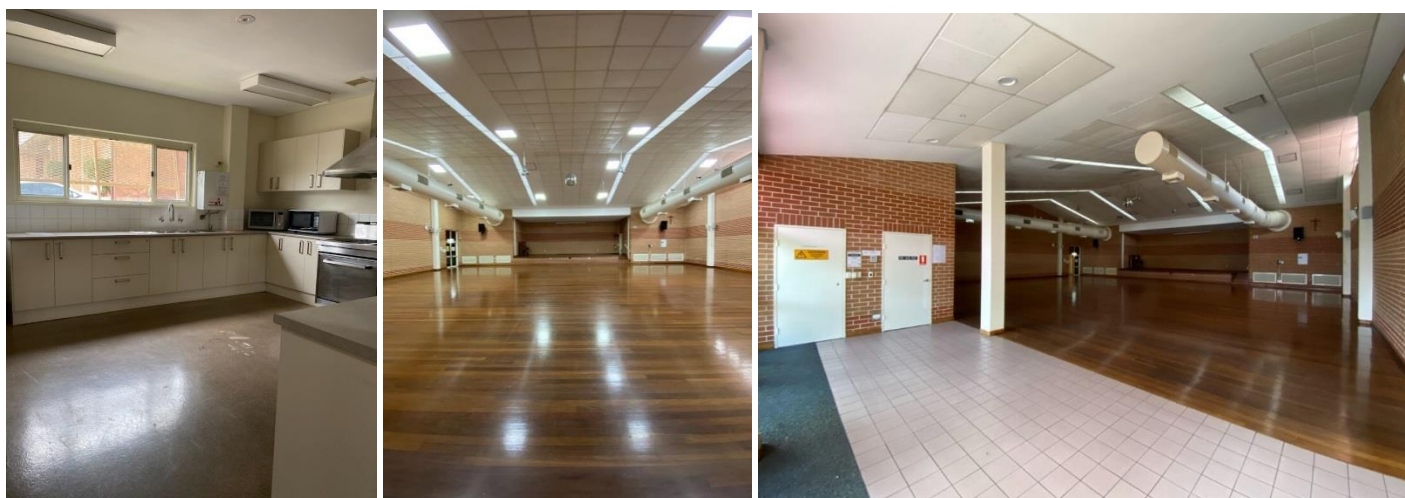

# The Liturgical Year

The Catholic Church sets aside certain days and seasons of each year to recall and celebrate various events in the life of Christ. In its Roman Rite the liturgical year begins with Advent, the time of preparation for both the celebration of Jesus' birth, and his expected second coming at the end of time. This season lasts until 24 December (Christmas Eve). Christmastide follows, beginning with First Vespers of Christmas on the evening of 24 December and ending with the Feast of the Baptism of the Lord.

## Advent

Advent (from the Latin word *adventus*, which means "arrival" or "coming") is the first season of the liturgical year. It begins four Sundays before Christmas, the Sunday falling on or nearest to 30 November, and ends on Christmas Eve. Traditionally observed as a "fast", it focuses on preparation for the coming of Christ, not only the coming of the Christ-child at Christmas, but also, in the first weeks, on the eschatological (final coming) of Christ, making Advent "a period for devout and joyful expectation".

This season is often marked by the Advent Wreath, a garland of evergreens with four candles. Although the main symbolism of the advent wreath is simply marking the progression of time, many churches attach themes to each candle, most often 'hope', 'faith', 'joy', and 'love'. *Liturgical colour: violet or purple; blue in some traditions*

## Christmas

The Christmas season immediately follows Advent. The traditional Twelve Days of Christmas begin with Christmas Eve on the evening of December 24 and continues until the feast of Epiphany. The actual Christmas season continues until the Feast of the Baptism of Christ, which in the present form of the Roman Rite is celebrated on the Sunday after 6 January, or the following Monday if that Sunday is Epiphany. *Liturgical colour: white*

## Lent

Lent is a major penitential season of preparation for Easter. It begins on Ash Wednesday and, if the penitential days of Good Friday and Holy Saturday are included, lasts for forty days, since the six Sundays within the season are not counted.

## **Passiontide**

In the pre-1970 form of the Roman Rite, the two weeks before Easter form the season of Passiontide, a subsection of the Lenten season that begins with Matins of Ash Wednesday and ends immediately before the Mass of the Easter Vigil. In this form, what previously was officially called Passion Sunday, has the official name of the First Sunday in Passiontide, and Palm Sunday has the additional name of the Second Sunday in Passiontide.

In the post-1969 form of the Roman Rite, "Passion Sunday" and "Palm Sunday" are both names for the Sunday before Easter, officially called "Palm Sunday of the Lord's Passion". The former Passion Sunday became a fifth Sunday of Lent. The earlier form reads Matthew's account on Sunday, Mark's on Tuesday, and Luke's on Wednesday, while the post-1969 form reads the Passion only on Palm Sunday (with the three Synoptic Gospels arranged in a three-year cycle) and on Good Friday, when it reads the Passion according to John, as also do earlier forms of the Roman Rite.

## **Holy Week -the week before Easter**

*Liturgical colour: violet or purple.* The colour rose may be used, where it is the practice, on Laetare Sunday (4th Sunday of Lent). On Palm Sunday the colour since 1970 is red, by earlier rules violet or purple, with red being used after 1955 for the blessing of the palms.

**Easter Triduum** consists of Good Friday, Holy Saturday and Easter Sunday. Each of these days begins liturgically not with the morning but with the preceding evening. The triduum begins on the evening before Good Friday with Mass of the Lord's Supper, celebrated with white vestments, and often includes a ritual of ceremonial foot washing. It is customary on this night for a vigil involving private prayer to take place, beginning after the evening service and continuing until midnight. This vigil is occasionally renewed at dawn, continuing until the Good Friday liturgy.

During the day of Good Friday Mass is not celebrated in the Catholic Church. Instead a Celebration of the Passion of the Lord is held in the afternoon or evening. It consists of three parts: a Liturgy of the Word that includes the reading of the account of the Passion by John the Evangelist and concludes with a solemn Universal Prayer.

**Holy Saturday** the day during which Christ lay in the tomb. In the Catholic Church, there is no Mass on this day; the Easter Vigil Mass, which, though celebrated properly at the following midnight, is often celebrated in the evening, is an Easter Mass.

The **Easter Vigil** is held in the night between Holy Saturday and Easter Sunday, to celebrate the resurrection of Jesus.

## **Easter season**

Easter is the celebration of Jesus' resurrection. The date of Easter varies from year to year, according to a lunar-calendar dating system. In the Roman Rite, the Easter season extends from the Easter Vigil through Pentecost Sunday.

*Liturgical colour: white, but red on the feast of Pentecost.*

## **Ordinary Time**

"Ordinary" comes from the same root as our word "ordinal", and in this sense means "the counted weeks". In the Roman Catholic Church and in some Protestant traditions, these are the common weeks which do not belong to a proper season. In Latin, these seasons are called the weeks per annum, or "through the year".

Ordinary Time consists of 33 or 34 Sundays and is divided into two sections. The first portion extends from the day following the Feast of the Baptism of Christ until the day before Ash Wednesday (the beginning of Lent).

*Liturgical colour: green*

## **Ordinary Time is divided into two sections: Time after Pentecost and Time after Trinity.**

This season, under various names, follows the Easter season and the feasts of Easter, Ascension, and Pentecost. Ordinary Time resumes on Pentecost Monday, omitting the Sunday which would have fallen on Pentecost. This season ends on the Saturday before the First Sunday of Advent. Feasts during this season include:

- *Trinity Sunday*, the first Sunday after Pentecost.
- *The Body and Blood of Christ*, on the second Sunday after Pentecost.
- *Sacred Heart of Jesus*, Friday in the third week after Pentecost.
- *Feast of Christ the King*, last Sunday before Advent.

### **Parish Privacy Policy**

1. The Parish collects personal information, including sensitive information, about members of the faithful. The primary purpose of collecting this information is to be able to administer the sacraments and pastoral care to the faithful, and to the children of the faithful. Information may be required to allow the Parish to meet some of its legal obligations, provide care for the child while under supervision and discharge its duty of care. If you reside in the Parish or elsewhere and continue to use its services, the information may also be used to solicit donations and/or request your services as a volunteer from time to time.
2. The Parish discloses personal address and telephone information to others within our Catholic Community only for administrative purposes. This includes other Parishes, the Diocese and to the school and also includes volunteers for rosters, sacraments etc.
3. Personal information may be collected for children for the purpose of administering the sacraments and pastoral care to children of the faithful. If this information is not provided we may be unable to offer Sacraments in our Parish Program.
4. Adults information is collected about them in the same manner for Sacraments and/or planned giving purposes.
