GOSPEL REFLECTION - The Transfiguration of the Lord

In today's Gospel, Peter, James, and John witness something very strange when they climb to the top of the mountain with Jesus. Without warning, Jesus clothing becomes dazzling white, while both Moses and Elijah appear and talk to him. A voice comes from a cloud that overshadows the group. Within seconds, the vision ends.

This vision is rich in symbolism. Moses symbolizes the Jewish laws, while Elijah represents the prophets.

Together, they stand for The Law and the Prophets, another name for the Jewish Scriptures. The purpose of the Scriptures is to prepare the world for the messiah who will conquer the world and hand the rule of the world over to God. With God in control, there will be no more pain or suffering or death. The Jews called this the reign or the kingdom of God.

The cloud overshadowing Jesus and his visitors would have reminded the apostles of the column of clouds God used to lead the Jewish people out of Egypt. Thus, the cloud is symbolic of God's presence.

The symbolism in the remainder of the reading also deals with the reign of God. The Jews pictured the saints wearing bright white clothing in God's kingdom, which is exactly how Jesus is dressed.

Peter offers to erect three tents(or booths). Because the Jews lived in tents when they were in the desert on their way to the Promised Land, tents were a symbol of God's saving power. Some Jews believed everyone will live in tents in the kingdom of God.

This symbolism about the reign of God is very important because it points to Jesus being the messiah even though he will not live up to popular expectations.

Instead of being the victorious military leader some Jews were waiting for, Jesus was to die the cruel and painful death of a common criminal. By everyone's standards, Jesus was a failure.

In today's Gospel, it is clear the apostles do not grasp the meaning of what Jesus is telling them because as they come down from the mountain we find them discussing what Jesus meant when he said he would rise from the dead. They, too, were looking for a victorious political/ military messiah who would not die.

For Reflection-

If the apostles had difficulty understanding what Jesus was telling them, it's understandable that today's society would have difficulty discerning God's will. Pray to the Holy Spirit to give wisdom to us, so we can discern God's will.

Dear brothers and sisters, buongiorno!

Today the Gospel tells the parable of a merchant in search of precious gemstones, who, Jesus says, "on finding one pearl of great value, went and sold all that he had and bought it" (*Mt* 13:46). Let us pause a little on the actions of this merchant, who first *seeks*, then *finds* and finally *buys*.

This man's first action: to seek. He is an enterprising merchant, who does not stand still, but leaves his house and sets out in search of precious pearls. He does not say: "I am satisfied with the ones I have"; he looks for more beautiful ones. And this is an invitation for us not to close ourselves up in habit, in the mediocrity of those who are complacent, but to revive desire: to revive the desire, so that the desire to seek, to go on, is not extinguished; to cultivate dreams of good, to seek the newness of the Lord, because the Lord is not repetitive, He always brings newness, the newness of the Spirit; He always makes the realities of life new (cf. Rev 21:5). And we must have this attitude: to seek.

The merchant's second action is to *find*. He is a shrewd person who "has a keen eye" and knows how to recognize a pearl of great value. This is not easy. Let us think, for example, of the fascinating oriental bazaars, where the stalls, full of goods, are crowded along the walls of streets full of people; or of some of the stalls one sees in many cities, full of books and various objects. Sometimes in these markets, if one stops to look closely, one can discover treasures: precious things, rare volumes that, mixed in with everything else, one does not notice at first glance. But the merchant in the parable has a sharp eye and knows how to find, he knows how to "discern" to find the pearl. This too is a teaching for us: every day, at home, on the street, at work, on holiday, we have the possibility of discerning good. And it is important to know how to find what counts: to train ourselves to recognize the precious gems of life and to distinguish them from junk. Let us not waste time and freedom on trivial things, pastimes that leave us empty inside, while life offers us every day the precious pearl of the encounter with God and with others! It is necessary to know how to recognize it: to discern in order to find it.

And the merchant's last action: he *buys* the pearl. Realizing its immense value, he sells everything, he sacrifices all his goods just to have it. He radically changes the inventory of his warehouse; there is no longer anything other than that pearl: it is his only wealth, the meaning of his present and his future. This too is an invitation for us. But what is this pearl for which one can renounce everything, the one of which the Lord speaks to us? This pearl is Him: it is the Lord! Seeking the Lord and finding the Lord, encountering the Lord, living with the Lord. The pearl is Jesus: He is the precious pearl of life, to be sought, found and made one's own. It is worth investing everything in Him because, when one encounters Christ, life changes like this, doesn't it? Your life ... you meet Christ and in this way your life changes.

Let us then resume the merchant's three actions: seeking, finding and buying – and ask ourselves some questions *Seeking*: am I searching, in my life? Do I feel fine, accomplished, am I satisfied, or do I exercise my desire for good? Am I in spiritual retirement? How many young people are in retirement! The second action, *finding*: do I practise discerning what is good and comes from God, knowing how to renounce what leaves me with little or nothing? Finally, *buying*: do I know how to spend myself for Jesus? Is He in first place for me, is He the greatest good in life? It would be nice to say to Him today: "Jesus, You are my greatest good". Each one of you in your heart, say now: "Jesus, you are my greatest good". May Mary help us to seek, find and embrace Jesus with all of ourselves.

After the Angelus

Dear brothers and sisters!

Today we observe two World Days declared by the UN: International Friendship Day and the World Day Against Trafficking in Persons. The first promotes friendship between peoples and cultures; the second combats the crime that turns people into commodities. Trafficking is a terrible reality, affecting too many people: children, women, workers..., so many exploited people; all living in inhuman conditions and suffering indifference and rejection by society. There is so much trafficking in the world today. God bless those who work to fight against trafficking.

Let us not cease to pray for beleaguered Ukraine, where the war is destroying everything, even grain. This is a grave offense to God, because grain is His gift to feed humanity; and the cry of millions of brothers and sisters who suffer hunger rises to Heaven. I appeal to my brothers, the authorities of the Russian Federation, that the Black Sea Initiative may be restored and grain may be transported safely.

The coming 4 August will mark three years since the devastating explosion in the port of Beirut. I renew my prayer for the victims and their families, who are seeking truth and justice, and I hope that Lebanon's complex crisis may find a solution worthy of the history and values of that people. Let us not forget that Lebanon is also a message.

I ask you to accompany me with prayer in my journey to Portugal, which will begin next Wednesday, on the occasion of World Youth Day. A great many young people, from all continents, will experience the joy of the encounter with God and with their brothers and sisters, guided by the Virgin Mary, who after the annunciation "arose and went with haste" (*Lk* 1:39). I entrust the World Youth Day pilgrims and all young people of the world to Her, shining star of the Christian path.

And now I greet you all, Romans and pilgrims from Italy and many countries. In particular, I greet the choir of children from Veliko Tarnovo, in Bulgaria, and the group of young Mexicans, as well as the teenagers from Biadene and Caonada. And I greet the young people of the *Immacolata*.

And I wish you all a good Sunday. Please, do not forget to pray for me.

POPE FRANCIS' ADRESS TO PORTUGUESE CHURCH LEADERS By Linda Bordoni

Praying Vespers in the 16th century Jeronimos Monastery in Lisbon on the first day of his visit to Portugal for World Youth Day 2023, Pope Francis urged the clergy and religious to proclaim the saving message of the Gospel with

renewed impetus in a world in which there is so much darkness. Addressing Portuguese Bishops, Priests, Deacons, Consecrated Persons, Seminarians and Pastoral Workers gathered in the ancient monastery on Wednesday evening, the Pope reflected on the readings of the Vespers that tell of the Lord's saving grace and of how Jesus changed the lives of his disciples by bringing God's closeness into the places and situations in which "people live, work and hope."

Find new ways to follow the Lord

Acknowledging the weariness that can burden men and women of the Church in times that are "buffeted by social and cultural changes and increasingly marked by secularism, indifference to God and growing detachment from the practice of the faith," the Pope invited them "to bring their struggles and tears to the Lord" and with open hearts find new ways to follow Him.

That weariness, the Holy Father said, "is often accentuated by the disappointment and anger with which some people view the Church, at times due to our poor witness and the scandals that have marred her face and call us to a humble and ongoing purification, starting with the anguished cry of the victims, who must always be accepted and listened to."

"Whenever we feel discouraged, we can feel tempted to leave the boat and become entangled in the nets of resignation and pessimism," the Pope said, Jesus comes to us "amid our feelings of solitude and our crises, in order to help us begin anew."

No to the 'administrators of the sacred'

Underscoring the relevance of this invitation, the Pope noted that when we feel discouragement and "retire" from apostolic zeal, "we risk becoming mere "administrators of the sacred: "It is very sad when a person who has consecrated his life to God becomes an "official", a mere administrator of things. It is very sad," and he appealed to those who may be bored and are living the mission as "a kind of job" to make room for "that repeated call of Jesus" and allow ourselves to be seduced by it.

Dear brothers and sisters, Pope Francis said: "We are surely living in difficult times, but the Lord is asking this Church: 'Do you want to leave the boat and plunge into disillusion, or will you let me enter and allow the newness of my words once more to take the helm? Do you want only to preserve the past which lies behind you, or do you want once again to lower the nets with enthusiasm for the catch?"

"The Lord" he said, "is asking us to revive our "restless" enthusiasm for the spread of the Gospel," and reiterating the need for a renewed missionary zeal, he asked his "Dear Portuguese friends" to set out from the shore, "not to conquer the world but to make it exult in the comforting joy of the Gospel."

"This is not the time to stop and give up, to drag the boat to shore or to look back. We must not take flight from the present out of fear, or take refuge in forms and practices of the past. Now is the God-given time of grace to sail boldly into the sea of evangelization and of mission," he added.

Thus, Pope Francis had three indications which, he said, are inspired by the Gospel.

Put out into the deep, share the journey, evangelize

"First," he said, "Put out into the deep." To lower the nets anew, he explained, it is necessary to leave disappointments and inertia, and "pass from defeatism to faith."

"A second choice," he continued, is "to work together in offering pastoral care."

This indication allowed the Pope to underscore, yet again, his belief that the Church is synodal: "She is communion, mutual assistance and shared journey."

That, he explained, is the aim of the current Synod, which will have its first general assembly in October.

"On the boat of the Church, there has to be room for everyone: all the baptized are called on board to lower the nets, becoming personally involved in the preaching of the Gospel."

Acknowledging that this "is a great challenge," he said that it is something to be done "without worldliness, yet not without the world." And speaking off-the-cuff to highlight this crucial concept, the Pope said "clericalism is one of the most serious evils that can happen to the Church," and he urged those present to overcome this risk "without ideologies, without worldliness."

"In the Church, we help each other, we support one another and we feel ourselves called to spread a climate of constructive fraternity beyond our own walls," he said.

"The third choice," he said, is to become fishers of men.

Noting that there is so much darkness in today's society, Pope Francis lamented the fact that "We seem to have lost a sense of enthusiasm, the courage to dream, the strength to confront challenges and to be confident about the future." He described the course of humanity as one that sails "amid doubts and economic uncertainty, an impoverishment of social friendship, and lack of hope."

"As Church, we are entrusted with the task of putting out into the waters of this sea and casting the nets of the Gospel, not pointing fingers but bringing to the men and women of our time an offer of new life, the life of Jesus," he continued.

'Bring the openness of the Gospel to today's multicultural society'

We are called, the Holy Father said, "to bring the openness of the Gospel to a multicultural society; to bring the closeness of the Father to situations of growing uncertainty and poverty, especially among young people. To bring the love of Christ wherever families are fragile and relationships wounded. To transmit the joy of the Spirit where discouragement and fatalism reign."

"Dear brothers and sisters," Pope Francis concluded, spelling out the fact that his invitation is directed to all - lay people, religious men and women, priests, bishops, everyone - "do not be afraid, cast your nets (...) do not accuse others but feel the invitation of Jesus" and don't turn the Church into a customs house.

It's an invitation, he said, to everyone: "To the righteous, to those who are well off, to those who are happily married and to everyone else" because the Church is made of everyone, "righteous and sinners, good and bad, everyone, everyone, everyone. And then the Lord help us to sort that out!"






