But they replied, "There may not be enough for us and for you; you had better go to those who sell it and buy some for yourselves." They had gone off to buy it when the bridegroom arrived. Those who were ready went in with him to the wedding hall and the door was closed. The other bridesmaids arrived later. "Lord, Lord," they said, "open the door for us." But he replied, "I tell you solemnly, I do not know you." So stay awake, because you do not know either the day or the hour.'

#### FROM FR. HENRY DUC



Dear Friends,

In Jesus' time, it was said that wedding celebrations usually took place in the evening. It began with the bridegroom and his friends making their way to the house of the bride. During their procession, they carried torches of oily rags and they needed an extra supply of oil to keep their torches alive.

To make it a pleasant surprise, the groom often tried to keep secret the day and time he chose to claim his bride, and only revealed it at the last minute. He then sent someone ahead to the bride's house to let people know that he was on his way.

When the groom arrived at her place with the groomsmen, the bride joined the procession to come to the groom's house accompanied with singing and dancing. During this time, people came out of their homes and into the streets to join the wedding festivities and congratulate the couple.

Once the procession arrived at the home of the groom, only the invited guests went inside. At this point, the main door was barred shut with a heavy beam to keep all the ceremonies and reception private.

This information provides the back-drop for the Gospel account this Sunday, in which Jesus utilised a wedding celebration with ten bridesmaids waiting for the arrival of the groom. Five of them were described as foolish for bringing no extra oil for their lamps and the other five as sensible for taking extra oil just in case their lamps run out of oil.

While they got tired and fell asleep, they were told that the groom was about to come, and they all got up to trim their lamps to welcome him. The foolish bridesmaids then found out that their lamps ran out of oil at this crucial time, they of course got into a panic and turned to their friends to lend them some oil, but were advised to go to the shop and buy it.

Unfortunately while they were out to look for more oil, the groom had arrived with his groomsmen, and all present entered the wedding room, and the door of the house was closed and got bolted. When the foolish bridesmaids came back, they begged to get in, but it was too late. The Lord, host of the party, refused to let them in, and they had to stay out, while others began to celebrate.

Jesus concluded this parable with the message telling us exactly what he meant to teach us, that we have to stay awake for the time of the Lord, which is unknown. We should get ready at all times like the sensible bridesmaids with our lives filled with the oil of God's grace and merits, otherwise we shall be sorry to miss the heavenly banquet, just as the foolish bridesmaids missed the wedding reception.

Let us ask the Lord to help us to heed and appreciate the message he aimed to convey to us today, and pray for the grace to support us in our efforts to fill our lives with the oil of goodness through what we do and say. Have a lovely week filled with lot of good works.

#### **POPE FRANCIS' ANGELUS**

Dear brothers and sisters, buongiorno!

From the Gospel of today's liturgy, we hear some of Jesus' words about the scribes and pharisees, the religious leaders of the people. Regarding these people in authority, Jesus uses very severe words, "for they preach, but do not practice" (*Mt* 23:3) and "they do all their deeds to be seen by others" (v. 5). This is what Jesus says – they preach and don't practice and everything they do they do to be seen.

So, let us pause on these two aspects: the distance between saying and doing, and the primacy of the exterior over the interior. The distance between saying and doing. Jesus contests the duplicity of the lives of these teachers of Israel, who claimed to teach others the Word of God and to be respected as Temple authorities. They preached one thing, but then lived another. These words of Jesus recall those of the prophets, in particular the prophet Isaiah: "This people draw near with their mouth and honour me with their lips, while their hearts are far from me" (Is 29:13). This is the danger to be on guard for: duplicity of heart. We too have this danger. This duplicity of heart puts the authenticity of our witness as well as our credibility as persons and as Christians at risk.

Because of our weakness, we all experience a certain distance between what we say and what we do. But having a duplicitous heart is something else instead. It is living with "one foot on both sides of the fence" without any problem. Let us remember this, especially when we are called to exercise a role of responsibility – in life, in society or in the Church – no to duplicity! This rule is always valid for a priest, a pastoral worker, a politician, a teacher, or a parent: be committed to living first yourself what you say, what you preach to others. To be authentic teachers, we first need to be credible witnesses.

The second aspect follows as a consequence: the primacy of the exterior over the interior. In fact, living in duplicity, the scribes and pharisees were concerned about having to hide their inconsistency to save their outward reputation. Indeed, if the people knew what was truly in their hearts, they would have been ashamed, losing all credibility. And so, they performed works to appear righteous, to "save face", as we say. This trick is very common – they put make-up on their faces, make-up on their life, make-up on their hearts... And these "made-up" people do not know how to live the truth. And many times, even we experience the temptation of duplicity.

Brothers and sisters, accepting this warning from Jesus, let us too ask ourselves: Do we try to practice what we preach, or do we live duplicitously? Do we say one thing and do something else? Are we concerned only about showing how impeccable we are on the outside, made-up, or do we also cultivate our interior life in sincerity of heart?

Let us turn to the Holy Virgin. May she who lived in integrity and humility of heart according to the will of God help us to become credible witnesses of the Gospel.

#### POPE FRANCIS INVITES CHILDREN TO TEACH WORLD THROUGH THEIR JOY AND PURITY

Pope Francis meets with 7,500 children from 84 countries in the Vatican, and emphasises the importance of learning from their innate joy and the unity they represent. *By Francesca Merlo* 

Pope Francis welcomed children from around the world to the Vatican's Paul VI Hall to share a few moments of joy and laughter during a meeting themed "Let's Learn from Boys and Girls."

Addressing the young audience, the Pope expressed his gratitude to the children, those who accompanied them, and the organisers of the event, including Cardinal José Tolentino and the Dicastery for Culture and Education, as well as Father Enzo Fortunato, who made the event possible. He also acknowledged all the other families and organisations whose contributions were essential to this event taking place.

#### Learning from children

Pope Francis began his address by acknowledging the theme as being a particular one, "Learn from children?" he asked. "Aren't children the ones who should learn?"

He responded to this question by emphasising the importance of learning from children, as they continually offer valuable lessons to the world. The Pope described how children embody the beauty of life in its simplicity and the joy of being together, two gifts from God that should be cherished.

"We need to learn from you," stressed the Pope. "I am always happy when I meet you because you teach me something new every time." Pope Francis then urged the children to proclaim together: "Life is a gift! God loves us! We are all brothers and sisters!"

#### A family gathering

The Holy Father went on to note that this gathering of children from all corners of the world was just like a reunion of siblings in a "big house" that Jesus has provided, symbolising the universal Church's embrace to all.

He highlighted the importance of creating an environment where children, no matter where they come from, always feel welcomed, loved, and accepted. Expressing his desire to personally greet each child, Pope Francis acknowledged that due to the large number present this would but be possible, but he did ensure that his words and blessings were extended to every child and, through them, to children worldwide. Pope Francis then shared his compassion for those children suffering due to war, hunger, disease, climate disasters, and poverty.

He reminded them to pray to the Blessed Virgin Mary. "Our Lady will help you," he said. "Always pray to the Blessed Virgin Mary." The Pope then invited the children to come forward with their own questions, which ranged from how to care for the environment and do good in our world.

# 'LIFE, MY STORY THROUGH HISTORY': A NEW BOOK ON LIFE OF POPE FRANCIS By Vatican News

"Life, My Story Through History", is the title of Pope Francis' new book in which he recounts for the first time the story of his life through the events that have marked the world, from the outbreak of the Second World War in 1939 when he was almost three years old, to the present day.

The book will be published by HarperCollins Publishers, which made the announcement on 7 November.

Developed with HarperCollins Italy, the book represents a global project for the publisher that will come out in the spring of 2024 in Italy, the United States, the United Kingdom, Canada, Brazil, France, Germany, Mexico, Poland, Portugal, Spain and South America.

#### **Events that changed the world**

This is the first time New York-based publisher HarperCollins has published a book by Pope Francis.

"Life, My Story Through History," citing a HarperCollins Italy press release of 7 November "is an extraordinary journey through the decades to retrace the most significant moments of our times, through the personal memories of the Pope. These include: the fall of the Berlin Wall, Videla's coup d'état in Argentina, the moon landing in 1969 and even the 1986 World Cup where Maradona scored the goal that went down in history as the 'mano de Dios.'"

The pubblication consists of memoirs of a priest who, from his very personal point of view, recounts the years of the Nazi extermination of the Jews, the atomic bombing of Hiroshima and Nagasaki, the great economic recession of 2008, the collapse of the Twin Towers, the pandemic, the resignation of Benedict XVI and the conclave that elected him Pope with the name of Francis. Events that," one reads, "intertwine with the life of the 'Callejero Pope' who exceptionally reopens the treasure chest of his memories to recount, with his trademark frankness, those moments that changed the world."

#### The latest topics and themes

At the same time, Pope Francis shares important views on the latest topics and current events: social inequality, the climate crisis, war, atomic weapons, racial discrimination, and battles in favour of life.

The Pope's voice alternates with that of narrator, Fabio Marchese Ragona, a 'Vaticanista' journalist for the Mediaset television group, who in each chapter describes the historical context in which the Pope lived.

#### Remembering to avoid repeating mistakes

The press release on the book shares some of what the Pope had to say on the book.

"In this book we tell a story, the story of my life, through the most important and serious events that humanity has experienced over the last eighty years. It is a book that sees the light so that, especially the younger generation, can listen to the voice of an elderly man and reflect on what our world has experienced, so as not to repeat the mistakes of the past. Let us think, for example, of the wars that have plagued and still plague the world.

Let us think of the genocides, the persecutions, the hatred between brothers and sisters of different religions! How much suffering!

Having reached a certain age, it is important, to reopen the book of memories and make remembrance: to learn by looking back, to identify the things that are not good, the toxic things that we have experienced along with the sins we have committed, but also to relive all that God has sent us that is good. It is an exercise in discernment that we should all do, before it is too late!"

"We are honoured to publish Pope Francis' book," said Brian Murray, president and CEO of HarperCollins Publishers. "From his life in Argentina to his election as Pontiff of the Catholic Church, Pope Francis has lived an exceptional life, witnessing some of the most decisive moments in recent history. 




